*Change tone - Approach,*

Senator Hubert H. Humphrey (D., Minn.) said today that the new "Quiet Diplomacy" of the Kennedy Administration has put Communism "on the defensive" in world affairs.

The Senator, speaking at an afternoon session of the National Conference on Disarmament, declared that the prospects for peace "have been greatly improved by the new tone of American foreign policy and diplomacy."

*New tone*  
"The era of <sup>investive</sup> investive, belicose slogans, threats and insults is over," Humphrey said.

*Loud talk.*  
"For too long, the United States and the Soviet Union were in a shouting match. Each side talked so loudly and so aggressively that neither could really hear the other.

"In such a match, the Communist propaganda machine was bound to win.

*Quiet Responsible Diplomacy*  
"Today there is a new tone in American foreign policy. The quiet diplomacy of the new Administration is not designed to win a war of words. Its purpose is to attain peace with justice and to extend freedom and social progress throughout the world.

*Strength*  
"The new quiet diplomacy has brought clarity and ~~force~~ strength to America's message of peace and freedom. The world is now listening, and the Communists are once again on the defensive.
