"Enclosed I hand you copy of Mr Carps letter which [I] showed to Mr Galusha and also to Mr [Donald A.] Smith as he passed thro' today Mr Smith says that both himself and Mr Stephen are very much pleased with the look of the St P & F Pac matters as shown in our statements maps &c and that he thinks the money matters will be very easy in England, in fact, I think he said it was about arranged.... Both Mr Smith and Mr Galusha thought Mr Carps letter simply meant th that we should give the Committee the privilege of 60 days in which to  up all the certifi-

cates and that we should agree to take all they had at that time." Encloses letter to Carp, approved by Galusha. Please forward, if you approve it, to his address in Utrecht, Holland. Re the Dutch offer "to furnish \$100,000 to complete the cut-off to Glyndon... I am quite satisfied that Msrs Smith & Stephen both expect that we will succeed and <sup>do</sup>lik upon the scheme with great favor." Re the Dutch offer to complete the Barnesville link. Farley wants nothing to do with George L. Becker; also re Red River and Manitoba Railroad.
