Re the "Kindred Road" through Crookston. "We have always held in reserve a section of land at Crookston expecting that we would require a large amount of ground ... for shops, and should this road fall into our hands this plan will be carried out." "I hope the people of C. will realize before it is too late that the Manitoba Company alone is better able to serve them than two lines can do. If they will take the trouble to go to Fergus Falls and Sauk Centre they will see that two lines simply killed both places."

Re prospects of two railroads at Crookston, probably running Crookston into debt. It would be better to vote the bonds of the Kindred road [other road was the Brainerd & Northwestern] if either has to be voted, for it may in time become a part of the Manitoba Road.
