William Hoyle to R. B. Angus.

Writes from Castlemere, England that "just now England is being pamphleteered thoroughly by men from the States, pushing this, that, or the other part."

He also mentions that Close, Bros. & Co. are advertising Iowa in general; that an agent of the Galveston, H[ouston][?] and San Antonio Line are advertising S.W. and middle Texas; and that "another agent speaks highly of 'Upper Iowa and  Minnesota.'" He also

mentions "Platte La [REDACTED]" of Colorado.
