Hill to H.H. Rogers, N.Y. carbon & letter-book
Details of the presidential campaign in Montana
Sent our coal engineer Lewis Stockett to Belt
and Sand Coulee to learn how miners would vote
He reported that our Sand Coal and Cottonwood
mines would go Republican and Belt would be
one third Republican and two thirds Independent
Democrat. "Our men are working hard for the
Republican ticket first and the Independent
Democrat next." "The vote of Butte and Ana-
conda will in my opinion decide the State. Your
people have always had the organization in
both these Cities, and I assume they will be
able to hold their own."
