Carbon. J.J.Hill to John S. Kennedy.

Is going East with Grover and hopes to get Grover, Olney, John G. Johnson and Judge Young together "for a sufficient time to thoroughly discuss the Northern Securities Case."

"Judge Lochren's decision deals with every aspect of the situation and applies the law as interpreted by the Supreme Court up to this time. You will note his decision considers the main aspect of the case in

reference to the testimony and to the law.
I think it is the general opinion that he
has considered the case fairly and decided
it according to law and without any at-
tempt at judicial legislation or to read
into the law language which Congress has
never used."
