Hill to Jacob Schiff

Views with alarm the growing dissatisfaction of a prosperous working class, the recent strikes, Morgan's giving in to them because Mark Hanna went to him when "the political campaign was urgent" and "the result was that the miners were shown the way to force their views on the mine owners, and the result has been higher prices of anthracite coal all over the land... I feel very strongly the absolute necessity of all railway interests working in intelligent harmony and try to allay the hostile feeling that is everywhere growing up."
