"I regret to say it had slipped my mind that I was a member of the Committee in regard to the statue of Governor Ramsey. During his lifetime I had a plaster cast made of the governor which I now have in my vault [it is now, 1966, in the possession of the Minn.Hist. Soc.] The likeness is an excellent one and I think is the only cast taken from life in existence."
