In 1884 the boats on the Great Lakes were not able to transport all the freight brought to Duluth by the railroads, four of which brought grain and flour -- the Manitoba, the St. Paul and Duluth, the Northern Pacific and the Omaha. The Duluth and Iron Range brought ore.
