### SCOPE AND CONTENTS OF THE RECORDS

The files document speeches, interviews, news conferences, remarks, comments, and testimony, and may house not only various versions and copies of the above, but also related correspondence, newsletters, conference brochures, newspaper articles, legislation, and background materials. They cover all aspects of the activities and interests of the office.

The chronological files (1985-1998) are individually foldered and listed by speech; the alphabetical files (ca. 1983-1988) are arranged and foldered by subject. The two sets have not been compared for duplicate materials.

### ARRANGEMENT OF THE RECORDS

The files are divided into two subseries: chronological (1985-1998; Boxes 1-10) and alphabetical by subject (ca. 1983-1988; Boxes 10-11).
