To the Sheriff of
Scott County,

Sir,

Representations have been made to me by the Citizens of Belle Plaine and vicinity of annoyance to whites from Sioux Indians in their vicinity. The law passed at the last Session forbids the absence of Indians from their own reservations, and makes it the duty of the Sheriffs of the different Counties to remove them from the lands owned by the white settlers.

You are hereby directed and commanded therefore, to remove any and all Indians that may be found upon the lands of private individuals within the County of Scott, and direct them to return to their own reservations. Should they refuse to comply, you will call the power of the County to your aid, and if insufficient, you will at once report the facts to me for ulterior proceedings.

Sir,

A large number of the citizens of Scott County have represented to me, that a band of Sioux Indians are now encamped in the neighborhood of Spring Lake, and of the village of Jordan, and that they have made threats of violence towards the whites. You are hereby commanded to remove such Indians from the limits of Scott County, and if necessary, to call upon the power of the County for that purpose, but before using force, you will notify the Indians to remove within a reasonable time. You will please to report to me your proceedings, and in your action, you will, of course, avoid unnecessary harshness or violence towards the Indians.

Sir,

Your favor of 21st has just been received. In reply, it is proper to state, that when a County is troubled by the intrusion of Indians contrary to law, that County should be responsible for the expenses attendant upon their removal by the proper authorities, and the Board of Supervisors should not hesitate to pay for the reasonable outlay of time and money of the Officers employed for that purpose. Before taking any further action with regard to those Sioux Indians who are now encamped within your County, I wish you to take with you a competent interpreter, and proceed to their camps, and give them notice to depart from the County in the direction of their own reservation within ten days, and you will please report to me their reply to your demand, and further, ascertain what has been and now is their deportment towards the white settlers. A reasonable compensation will be paid by the State to the Interpreter for his services.
