**Location**

- 112.I.8.3B-2 --- Report of interstate waters and fish therein, [1901?].  
A county-by-county list of lakes and rivers, with their location (range, township, section), acreage, nature of water (e.g., clear, not clear, muddy), and a checklist of species of food fish found in each. There are no figures on numbers of fish. (The year date is speculated from a letter found in the volume; state laws and commission reports for 1897-1903 do not appear to address any fish census activity or requirement.)
- see below Fish Distribution Records, 1909-1915. 3 volumes.  
County-by-county registers of fish delivered to lakes and streams by the three state fish hatcheries. For each shipment, the register gives date, name [of person receiving the fish?], address, name of lake or stream, and numbers of cans of various species of fish delivered (sometimes including an estimate of total number of fish).
- 112.I.8.3B-2 --- Deerwood [or Detroit] Hatchery.
- 112.I.8.4F-1 --- Glenwood Hatchery.  
St. Paul Hatchery.
- 112.I.8.4F-2 --- Hatchery Records, 1914-1919.  
A register, supplemented by various loose inserts, of the numbers of various species of fish received (as eggs) from breeders or other hatcheries, the prices thereof, and numbers hatched and planted. Information is present for the St. Paul, Glenwood, Detroit, Granite Falls, Bemidji, Tower, Ranier, and Otter Tail fish hatcheries, the Mississippi River [hatchery?], and for fish placed in the vicinity of the Fairmont (Martin County) dam and chain of lakes.

- 112.I.8.4F-2 --- Miscellaneous Register, 1903-1911.  
This volume contains:
- (a) Hatchery records for St. Paul and Glenwood, 1903-1906 (pp. 1-15, 210).  
Register entries give year, county, post office address, lake or stream, name of applicant, kind of fish, and number of fish [delivered].
  - (b) Pheasants distributed, 1907, 1908, 1910 (pp. 59-61).  
Name, post office address, date, and number. (This information is duplicated in the 1908 and 1910 biennial reports.)
  - (c) Shipment of big game, 1907-1911 (pp. 74-78)  
Entries for each year give county and numbers of moose and deer. (Information for 1907-1908 is duplicated in the 1908 biennial report.)
