INTRODUCTION OF HAROLD BARKER by Mayor Hubert H. Humphrey

The effeciency of our government and the integrity of its administration is in a great part dependent upon the competition which exists within the party, and between the two political parties. This is the American way. It is our own means of guaranteeing government by the people and for the people.

Tonight it is my privilege to introduce to the radio audience the endorsed candidate of the Democratic Farmer Labor party for the office of governor. The gentleman who is about to speak to you is a resident of Elbow Lake, Minnesota. His name is Harold Barker.
