Son of the distinguished author, O. E. Rolvaag, professor at St. Olaf College and author of "Giants in the Earth."

Worked 6½ years in the logging camps and cattle ranches of Idaho and Washington.

Graduated from St. Olaf College, Northfield, Minnesota, in 1941. Was president of senior class and honor student in history. Postgraduate studies in Political Science, University of Minnesota.

Is prepared to devote his life to the cause of honest and efficient government.

Was married in 1943 to Florence Boedeker.

Is an active member of St. John's Lutheran Church, Northfield, Minnesota.

HIS ARMY CAREER

Entered the army as a private upon graduation from St. Olaf College, Northfield, Minnesota in 1941.

Served with the 3rd Armored Division at Camp Polk, La.

Sent to Ft. Knox, Ky. where the 5th Armored Division was activated; then sent to the California desert for maneuvers.

After 22 months of service as an enlisted man he was graduated from Officer's Candidate School and was assigned duty as a tank commander.

Sent overseas 1943 with a tank company of the 4th Armored Division.

He received battle stars for participation in the Normandy and Rhineland campaigns.

Received multiple wounds in September 1944, and was hospitalized until September 1945 when he was retired to inactive duty.

Decorated with the Silver Star for gallantry in action.

Member of the American Legion, V.F.W and A.V.C. organizations.


Dear Sir:-
