United States Senator Hubert H. Humphrey will spend Wednesday, September 29, in Winona, making a series of public appearances.

Bringing his campaign for re-election into Winona County as part of a tour of southeastern Minnesota, Senator Humphrey will address three Winona colleges during the day, speak at a joint luncheon of the Rotary, Kiwanis, Lions, and Exchange Clubs, and attend the 50th anniversary dinner of the Winona Trades and Labor Council in the Winona Redmen's Wigwam.

The day will be climaxed with a DFL Rally in the Redmen's Auditorium, with Senator Humphrey as the guest speaker.
