the Sixth Fleet made its dramatic run to the Eastern Mediterranean at the height of the Jordanian crisis. Humphrey, who is Chairman of the Senate Subcommittee on the Near East, is making an intensive personal study of the whole Middle East situation, planning on his return to the Senate in Mid-May to launch a formal investigation of American foreign policy in the Middle East.

While in the Roma-Naples area, Senator Humphrey had an audience with the Roman Catholic pontiff, Pope Pius XII, whom he termed a "very great spiritual leader" and to whom he gave the greetings of the people of Minnesota.
