HUMPHREY CRITICIZES "LITTLE LEADERSHIP" OF GOP

ST. LOUIS, Missouri, Sept. 8 -- Senator Hubert H. Humphrey tonight denounced the "little leadership" of the Republican Administration and called for "a grand design for a period of growth and greatness."

Minnesota's senior Senator spoke at the annual convention of the International Association of Machinists here.

"We are living in big and exciting years," Humphrey said. "This is a great age of big problems, and of big opportunities."

"For too long we have been adrift with little men at the helm, men of little vision, little daring, and too little concern for people."

Humphrey emphasized what he called "too little leadership in foreign policy," and added:

"We have had too little economic expansion and growth. We have too little respect for and appreciation of American labor. We have had too little concern for economic justice for the farmer."

The Senator said that America "can not answer the threats of Khrushchev and Castro unless we have the leadership and determination to invest in our nation's strength and growth."

Humphrey called for "sound investments" to assure a strong defense force, better schools, improved health facilities and "above all the increased usefulness and productivity of our people."

"What sort of future does America have," he asked, "if four and a half million citizens cannot find jobs?"

"What sort of future does America have if healthy and eager boys just out of high school find nothing to do but stand on the streets, waiting for excitement -- and trouble?"

Humphrey called for establishment of an Area Redevelopment Program to help reduce unemployment and approval of his Youth Conservation Corps proposal to help cut down juvenile delinquency.

"These are investments in America's strength, in America's future," he added.

"We must have leadership that will awaken the people to the needs of these and other investments which America can and must afford."

"It is time to put a grand design into our national effort," he concluded. "It is time to let the American people know that they are being called to a period of growth and greatness."

Asia and Africa, the Communists are pouring steady streams of words and people into the newly emerging nations.

Communist determination and ruthlessness are undiminished. We saw proof of that during the time of the U-2 incident and the torpedoing of the summit conference.

We must rise to answer these threats. Our answer to the Khrushchevs and the Castros of the world must be a free America, ^{a Just} which is growing, thriving, moving forward.

Our answer must be a free nation which rejects "adequacy" and "moderation" and strives for excellent schools, health programs, housing projects.

And our final and ultimate answer must
be fulfillment of the greatness within America,
a full exertion of the spirit, the vigor, the
zeal and the dedication that is our great
heritage in this land of the free, and home
of the brave.
