The precision with which he has acted as our Commander-in-chief, the firmness with which he has laid it on the line to Premier Khruschev, the due caution and deliberation which he used in order to believe our allies of Latin America and Europe behind us, have won the admiration of the world.

The President's historic action -- While fraught yet with the greatest possible danger to the entire world, -- may very well prove to have spared the world from the awful destruction of nuclear warfare. He has acted as the surgeon, who cuts sharply to save life.
