CApitol 4-3121, Ext. 2424 Senate Majority Whip Hubert H. Humphrey (D-Minn.) said tonight that American people will give an overwhelming endorsement to President Johnson this Fall because they want to continue the Kennedy-Johnson program to Build a Better America. Humphrey told a state Democratic Jefferson-Jackson Day Dinner in Milwaukee that President Johnson will lead Democrats to the greatest victory they have ever known in the Midwest and his influence will be felt throughout the ticket. He said the main battleground in this Fall's elections will be in the House and Senate races. These contests, he said, will provide "an opportunity to give President Johnson the votes he needs in Congress to give a 'Better Deal' to the American people. "He needs those votes," Humphrey added, "to build a Better America...to give Better Education to our children... to build a Healthier America... to Build Better roads... to provide Better Transportation--in short, to give the American epople the means and the opportunity to secure the better things in life for themselves and their children." Humphrey praised Gov. John Reynolds for the "strong and courageous fight he made against Gov. Wallace and what he stands for "in the Wisconsin presidential primary.

"Your governor didn't hesitate one minute in taking up the challenge," Humphrey said. "We are proud of him for making the fight and for pointing up the moral issue involved in the civil rights struggle."

Humphrey said that Wisconsin voters also can be proud of its two Senators--Gaylord Nelson and William Proxmire.

He said that Proxmire's re-election would assure Wisconsin of growing influence in the U.S. Senate where power is firmly based on seniority.

"Bill Proxmire is making big moves up the seniority ladder on three important committees--Appropriations, Banking and Currency and the Joint Economic Committee," Humphrey said.

"Bill Proxmire is 32nd in rank for continuous service in the Senate and is one of the few Midwestern Democrats with a leg up the important seniority ladder. Bill already is chairman of the Small Business Subcommittee of the Banking and Currency Committee.

Humphrey said the Senators who have seniority are chairmen of committees and subcommittees; they have the power to make or break legislative proposals and they are in a position to see that certain things do or do not get done.

"We hear a lot of talk about how powerful the Southern Senators are--and for good reason," Humphrey said. "Their constituents see to it that they have seniority."

"Let me point out one fact," Humphrey said. "In the last 18 years the three states of Virginia, Georgia and Alabama have sent only one new Senator to Washington-Herman Talmadge of Georgia in 1957."

As a result, he said, Virginia now has Harry Byrd as chairman of the Finance Committee and Willis Robertson as chairman of the Banking and Currency; Alabama has Lister Hill as chairman of the Labor and Public Welfare Committee and John Sparkman as chairman of the Select Committee on Small Business; and Georgia has Richard Russell as chairman of the Armed Services Committee.

"The lesson for the voters of Wisconsin," Humphrey said, "should be obvious."
