As a former member of the United States delegation to the United Nations, and as Vice President of my country, I have looked on UNICEF as one of the most worthwhile undertakings going on in the world.

The people of the United States believe in UNICEF -- as has been shown by their financial support, year after year.

I have traveled throughout a good deal of the less-developed world. And, as I have traveled, my heart has been torn by the poverty, hunger and suffering I have found among innocent children. A good number of these children never live to reach adulthood. And who can say what their loss means to mankind in terms of intelligence,

talent and potential productivity wasted?

But others survive. And they are the people who will in large part shape the future of their nations.

do no less than make our commitment to UNICEF and to other programs which can help bring hope to those without hope...which can help preserve precious human life... which help build a world of peace.

And as we do give our support, we shall benefit not only those we seek to help...but we shall help ourselves as well. For the giving of life and hope to children can help make each of us a better citizen of the world in which we live.
