catch. Techniques are being developed to raise infant
lobsters in fisheries for the first few weeks, saving them
from predators until they are big enough to learn the art
of survival.

L In programs of economic development, the federal government has worked closely with your business leaders to create new industries that are offering 5, thousand new jobs in Maine.

L More than 16 million dollars have been made available for Maine businessmen under this program.

L The success of this program owes much to the leadership of Senator Muskie and Congressman Hathaway.

and Department of Agriculture research specialists are working with your farmers to develop a new cash crop for Maine -- sugar beets. This could become an important part of the farm economy. The state now has a 33 thousand acre allotment in Aroostook County.

L In the past five years the Agricultural Research Service has spent 70 per cent more in Maine than over the previous five years.
