He has introduced a bill for a Trans-Maine highway that will make your marvelous ski slopes more accessible to sportsmen from outside the state.

One of my responsibilities as Vice President is to serve as chairman of the President's Marine Resources and Engineering Development Council.

We are working on a wide varity of research projects, including fish-flour processing plants that could potentially, have enormous impact in this state.

We are trying to find ways to increase the lobster catch. Techniques are being developed to raise infant lobsters in fisheries for the first few weeks, saving them from predators until they are big enough to learn the art of survival.

This, too, is enormously important to your economy.

In programs of economic development, the federal government has worked closely with your business leaders to create new industries that are offering 5 thousand new jobs in Maine.

More than 16 million dollars have been made available for Maine businessmen under this program.

The success of this program owes much to the leadership of Senator Muskie and Congressman Hathaway.

Department of Agriculture research specialists are working with your farmers to develop a new cash crop for Maine -- sugar beets. This could become an important part of the farm economy. The state now has a 33 thousand acre allotment in Aroostook County.

In the past five years the Agricultural Research Service has spent 70 per cent more in Maine than over the previous five years
