You know of the inspiring work which Lutheran World Relief has been performing in the Developing Countries. Just a few days ago, I noted that the Board of the Lutheran World Relief had allocated a new program of aid to 5500 refugees in a place some Americans have hardly heard of --Zambia, including 40 tons of used clothing.

WESTERN EUROPE -- NEED FOR EXCHANGES

At the end of this week, I'll be leaving on a brief trip to the NATO nations.

Strengthening the Atlantic Alliance is not just a responsibility for a Vice President, or for diplomats and government officials; it is a job for international student-to-student effort.

We must develop institutional means whereby there will be more, not less, fruitful -- open -- contact between the students of America and those of Western Europe and other areas of the world. CARD #5b

The Congress will consider how Government can openly -- frankly -- render assistance to people-to-people ties.

But there will be greater need for <u>private</u> philanthropy and initiative to assist international student and other exchanges. CARD #6a

SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAM -- 1967 AND THE DRAFT

From this luncheon I am proceeding to a Press Conference which I will be making **some** of the first announcements of the 1967 Summer Job Program for needy youth.

In 1965 and again in 1966, President Johnson's Youth Opportunity Task Force of which I was Chairman, helped generate a million extra jobs for underprivileged young people. This year, we expect to surpass that total. In addition, our mandate for youth has broadened to include providing a summer camping experience for many youngsters of the Inner Cities who have never known the chance to camp, as well as other opportunities.
