Thank you, Mayor Shriver, for these keys

to your city of Galveston. You never know

It is a real pleasure to be here -- regretably. some three months after I had expected to visit. As many of you know, I was called back to Washington and could not carry through my plans in late April.

At that time, I asked Dr. Edward Wenk, of the National Council on Marine Resources and Engineering Development, to carry on for me. He reported to me on the gracious hospitality and the local initiative and capabilities in marine sciences that I missed.

Apart from that inducement, I assured

Congressman Brooks that I would be back, and I am.

This is an opportunity for me to learn more about a unique, highly developed shoreline area.

The three ports of Galveston, Texas City and

Houston account for a tremendous volume of cargo movement -in fact, ranking second in the country.

Shellfish grow in this coastal zone. the beaches afford attractive recreational areas ... there is fine sport fishing. Shrimp provide a significant source of income. And of course there is the development in this area of our vast, off-shore oil and gas reserves.

The seawalls protecting Galveston Island from hurricanes, the Intracoastal Waterway, and the Houston Ship Channel are dramatic examples of using engineering science to modify the marine environment to man's benefit.

And the imaginative studies of Galveston Bay and activities of the air and water pollution agencies show what can be done to arrest the harm to our environment.

I look forward to learning more about the pioneering research in marine biology being carried on at both Texas A&M Laboratory and the BCF Laboratory.

I have been told something of the possibilities for new oceanographic facilities for Texas A&M University and

the Gulf Universities Research Corporation on Pelican

Island

The work being carried on here will mean jobs_

It will help provide answers to some of man's oldest problems.
