THIS IS THE KIND OF WORK, MY FELLOW AMERICANS, THAT IS GOING TO HELP US BUILD THE STRONGER AND THE BETTER AMERICA THAT EVERY ONE OF US WANTS. IT WAS A HARD SUMMER FOR AMERICA IT WAS A SUMMER OF TROUBLE AND, IN MANY PLACES, DISCOURAGEMENT. I FOR ONE, THINK WE'RE GOING TO COME THROUGH
OUR TROUBLES ALL THE STRONGER AND ALL THE BETTER -IF WE KEEP OUR FAITH and Confilence.

I THINK WE CAN SEE IT THROUGH HERE IN AMERICA

TO THE FREE AND PRODUCTIVE SOCIETY EVERY ONE OF US

WANTS -- A SOCIETY WHERE EVERY SINGLE AMERICAN STANDS

FREE AND EQUAL, IN PEACE AND IN GOOD WILL, WITH EVERY

OTHER AMERICAN...WHERE PEOPLE HAVE JOBS AND THE BEST

OF HEALTH AND EDUCATION FOR THEIR CHILDREN.

AROUND US TOO K AMERICA STILL HAS THE VISION

AND THE COURAGE TO STAND FAST AGAINST AGGRESSION AND
