↳ During these past two days, significant steps have been taken toward achieving a peaceful world.

↳ On Sunday night President ~~Johnson~~ Johnson extended the hand of peace to North Vietnam in a way designed to bring about prompt and productive negotiations.

↳ In another dimension of peace, I was privileged in Mexico City to sign, on behalf of our government a treaty removing the threat of

↳ Senator Morse and Congressman Roybal joined me in my official delegation, along with other distinguished Americans.

↳ This treaty ~~is~~ ^{was} an important step in curbing the nuclear arms race.

↳ It represents tangible progress in achieving favorable action on the nuclear non-proliferation treaty now pending in the United Nations.

∟ These steps are but further evidence that the struggle for peace is not easy, but requires patience, perseverance and sacrifice.

∟ We were privileged to spend two days in Mexico representing President Johnson and the American people. ∟ I met with Seu-Ordaz President Diaz Ordaz and the members of his government discussing matters of mutual concern in a spirit of constructive cooperation.

∟ Wherever we went, we were greeted with friendship and good will.

∟ Wherever we went, we reaffirmed our support for the peaceful action and social revolution being waged in Mexico.

∟ We were impressed with the vitality and the spirit of the people of Mexico and gratified by their respect and friendship for America.

∟ Mexico City will be host for the Olympic Games. We

visited the sites and the facilities for these great sports events.

∟ Intensive preparations are under way to assure that the

Olympics of 1968 will be a success.

∟ I am sure you know that I was saddened by President

Johnson's announcement that he will not seek re-election.

∟ I believe that the record of President Johnson's

Administration will be marked in history for unprecedented

social progress here at home and courageous action for peace

and freedom abroad.

∟ I hope that his new initiatives announced Sunday night

may bring the blessings of peace to our country and to

Southeast Asia.
