

The Ray Hackney Scholarship Fund was created in 1965, following the untimely death of our late Vice President, whose name it bears, with the purpose of carrying on the work to which he devoted so much of his time and energy.

The interest that has been received on the money which is invested has allowed the Ray Hackney Scholarship Fund to place into effect four scholarships of 2,000 dollars each, over a period of four years. In 1967 and again in 1968, one scholarship was given within the United States to a CWA member, or the son or daughter of a CWA member, and one was given in South America to a member, or the son, or 11 daughter of a member of a union affiliated with the Postal, 12 Telegraph and Telephone International.

The Scholarship Committee again wishes to thank those 14 locals and individuals that have either donated or pledged to donate to the Fund, since it is their efforts that have made 16 possible the accomplishments of the Fund to date.

As stated by CWA President Beirne at the outset, "The 18 scholarship Fund will do more than help a deserving young man or woman to fulfill an educational dream. It will be a 20 living memorial to every single one of us who have worked 21 to make CWA great. We would have no better, no more fitting symbol of our own than the understanding, the self- 23 help, the generosity offered through the Ray Hackney 24 Scholarship Fund." Therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That all CWA Locals are again urged to 26 pledge one dollar per member to this Fund, and be it further 27

RESOLVED: That this 30th Anniversary Convention of 28 the Communications Workers of America again encourages all persons who knew the late Ray Hackney to donate to this Fund, and be it further

RESOLVED: That efforts be continued to raise funds for 32 this purpose until the original goal of \$300,000 has been reached, and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Ray Hackney Scholarship Committee continue to grant such scholarships as the interest on 36 monies in the Fund will permit.
