AIRPORT SPEECH, SALINA, KANSAS

MAYOR YOST: We have looked forward to this day with great anticipation. Seldom do we have a distinguished visitor such as you in our city and as mayor, I am proud to present to you a proclamation designating you as an honorary citizen of Salina, and with it, I would like to present you with a key to the City of Salina and we want to welcome you and extend to you the hospitality of our community and wish you the best of everything while you are in our city. (Applause).

VICE-PRESIDENT HUMPHREY: Thank you, thank you.

MAYOR YOST: As a representative of our city, I have just presented our most distinguished visitor an honorary citizen title to our city and I presented him with our official key, and at this time I am honored and it is a privilege to introduce to you a fellow Salinan, Mr. Hubert H. Humphrey, the Vice-President of the United States. (Applause).

VICE-PRESIDENT HUMPHREY: Thank you, thank you.

Thank you very much, Mr. Mayor. I have never known that one could get citizenship so quickly as you are able to bestow it here, but I have been told by Governor Docking that in Kansas anything is possible and in Kansas they do things in a big way and in Salina, Kansas, they do it in the best way. (Applause.) So, Mayor Yost, Mrs. Humphrey and myself wish to extend our thanks to you for your

courtesy, for your presence here today, for your warm welcome, warm in every sense, warm in terms of the temperature. I noticed the temperature report that was given to us. It said, "On your arrival, Mr. Vice-President, the temperature will be approximately 83. On your departure, it will be approximately 88." Which means that I bring you five degrees of hot air according to the readings that I have. Mr. Mayor, you have given me a title of honorary citizen of Salina, Kansas; you have given me a key to your city. I am going to consult with the members of your official body to see whether these gifts give me any special privileges and whether or not this permits one to exceed the speed limit or do other things that other citizens would like to do but are unable to do and, if so, my good friend, Mr. Mayor, I shall give you the assurance that I will try to set a good example of law observance and respect for the laws of your community despite any special privileges that might be included herein.

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Governor Docking is one of the great governors of the fifty states of this land. It has been the privilege of Muriel Humphrey and myself to know Governor Docking and his wife Meredith and his very fine mother, Mrs. Virginia Docking, and the former governor, the father of Bob, and I want you good friends in Kansas to know how

highly honored the Humphreys are for this gift of friend-1 ship which has been bestowed upon us by this your first 2 family. We hope during our all too brief visit in 3 Salina, Kansas, that we will be able to convey to you a 4 kind of fellowship and friendship which is genuine and 5 sincere. We hope to be able to do here, as the editor of 6 your paper, the Journal, indicated, not only to be with 7 you but to listen to you, to listen to your concerns, to 8 open our minds and our hearts to the worries and the concerns of the people, as well as to hear the great faith 10 and confidence that the people of this great mid-America 11 have in this nation. I am proud to be a Midwesterner and 12 I believe there is a special quality in this part of 13 America which stands this nation well and it is that 14 quality of unbounded faith in the achievements of this 15 nation and in the capacity of this country to do what 16 needs to be done, whatever may be the problem or whatever 17 may be the challenge. I am one of the optimists of 18 America and I want to solicit more of them. I believe 19 there is a great silent majority in this country that 20 loves this nation with a deep dedication, that wants to 21 see it do what is right, that is willing to remedy the 22 inequities, that is unafraid of any challenge anywhere, 23 and I hope to be at least in part the spokesman for that 24 great silent majority in America and arouse them into 25

action to do what this country needs to have done and to do it peacefully, to do it orderly and to do it promptly. I believe we can do it and I look forward now to coming amongst you and shaking hands and seeing you, and by the way, I want to compliment you on those signs, even that one that I see over here. It reads, "Well, it's too bad it's not going someplace", but (applause) the other signs look to me that they have a great future and I want to come over and shake hands with their standard bearers. Thank you very much. Mr. Yost.

MAYOR YOST: At this time I have the pleasure of introducing the Marshal of Dodge City who has a presentation to make. Marshal Raymond House.

VICE-PRESIDENT HUMPHREY: Mr. Marshal, you come up here, this is what I've been waiting for.

MARSHAL HOUSE: Mr. Vice-President, in these days law enforcement is after all the help that we can get and we are prepared to go to the highest places after it. We would like, sir, to add to the terrific weight you already bear an additional responsibility, if you will please accept this warrant appointing you Deputy Marshal of Dodge City.

VICE-PRESIDENT HUMPHREY: This is great.

MARSHAL HOUSE: Now, Mr. Vice-President, your badge of office.

VICE-PRESIDENT HUMPHREY: Yes, sir.

MARSHAL HOUSE: And Saturday night at the Long Branch Saloon, sir, if we need help, we'll call you.

VICE-PRESIDENT HUMPHREY: Thank you, sir. May I first of all thank you, Mr. Marshal, Mr. House, for this certificate that makes me the Honorary Deputy Marshal of Dodge City. I guess my name is changed now from Hubert to Festus and it sure is good to meet you, Matt Dillon. I always knew you were a good looking man, I am one of your fans. I sort of open up the West and save the honor of the ladies of the community, fight the bad men, with the good struggle every week when the show comes on, and what a joy it is now at long last to have the evidence that I have been telling the men of the press and the television and radio that I am from Dodge City and I am the Deputy Sheriff. And may I suggest that you all watch out what you're up to. Thank you very much. (Applause.)

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
