

SPEECH OF VICE PRESIDENT HUBERT H. HUMPHREY

on

FRIDAY NIGHT, AUGUST 2, 1968

at

COBO HALL - RECEPTION - BALLROOM B

FRANK SINATRA: Ladies and gentlemen,

may I have your attention, please?

First of all, may I say my, reiterate what I said on the stage when I said you have been a tremendous help to bring about a mood and instill in the minds of other people about voter registration which, I said, is the basis for our structure.

And that is the extent of my speech because I sing songs and don't make speeches.

But I would like to have you meet the Honorable Vice President of The United States, Hubert H. Humphrey.

(Applause.)

VICE PRESIDENT HUMPHREY: Thank you very much, Frank Sinatra. For the good of the country, I don't sing --

(Laughter and applause.)

-- and I'll try not to make some speeches tonight. All I wanted to do was express our thanks to you for your generous cooperation.

I am sure all of us are indebted to

Frank Sinatra, Trini Lopez, Pat Henry, for this wonderful
entertainment. Well, this is the kind of politics, by the
way, which I think sells, and I hope you will take the
message out this evening, out to your neighbors and friends.

The purpose, of course, was to aid the program of voter registration. And now that Frank Sinatra has told you that his purpose was to help in voter registration, let me tell you what my purpose: Once you get them registered, I would like them to vote for Humphrey.

(Applause.)

But, in all candor and sincerity, we would like to get them registered.

I am very happy to see party officials here from the State of Michigan. I am very pleased some of the members of Congress could join us today.

We have had a wonderful day in Metropolitan Detroit; it was a bright and pleasant day. It's been a happy day, a busy one and an exciting one.

We will be here a short time tomorrow.

Frank Sinatra and his group will be going to Philadelphia tomorrow night where they will be doing everything the same and everything as good as it was this evening. It is Frank Sinatra's hometown. He is a Jersey boy, but they come charging across the frontiers over to Philadelphia to see

him; it will be a great night. And there are several other concerts he will be giving for us and making it possible to make this great effort to raise necessary funds and do the necessary job for voter registration. I don't know anybody in America who is doing more to help in this all-important endeavor to get all people to be participants in the democratic process. We have a lot of people who talk about it - Frank Sinatra is doing something about it.

(Applause.)

Finally, let me say I sure like to see that button. He's got a button on that has "FS" and there is a little line and then it says "HHH". I like that.
