But beyond the partisanship of the hour, beyond the banners and the slogans, lie the grim realities -- and the great opportunities -- of America's future.

One week from tonight the people will have recorded their solemn choice ... their choice of who shall lead us all for the next four fateful years.

It's the last week of Campaign - We're going to win (Election in the Bag)  
We're going to win - We trust the People & the People know they can't trust us - (Trust & Trusts)

∠ For on January 20, when the balloons have collapsed and the confetti is gone, when the television commercials are silent and the crowds have gone home -- on January 20, one man will stand alone on the steps of the Capitol in Washington and take the solemn oath as President of the United States of America.

∠ Under that man's leadership, this country will take a new direction -- and so will the world.

∠ The choice the American people make ~~in~~ days from now will chart a course for all mankind.

∠ I want to talk with you tonight about that course -- about what kind of a President, I will be if the people give me that chance.

#1 First, I will by my every word and deed try to earn and deserve the people's trust.

∠ I will tell the people the hard truths about our world.

∠ I will open the White House doors and listen to the people.

∠ I approach this subject in difficult times.

∠ Never have we had more need for a leadership of strength and wisdom ... to heal ... to guide ... to reconcile ... and to help us find a new sense of confidence in ourselves.!

∠ Never has there been a greater need for people to learn once again to trust one another. *Trust*

∠ And never has the need been greater for the people to trust their President.

∠ We must have an Open Presidency.

-- a Presidency that can close the widening gap  
between Americans living in cities and towns and government  
in far-off Washington;

-- a Presidency that can enable each American to  
feel that he is an important part of the democratic process  
despite our bigness;

-- a Presidency responsive to the people ... ~~not just~~  
~~at the end of a long chain of bureaucracy ... but directly.~~

∟ I shall have such an open Presidency ... and I shall  
be a people's President.

In the next four years, there are three great  
realities that must be faced by our people ... and by their  
President.

First is the reality of war ... or peace.

-- not just for ourselves;

-- but for all mankind.

∟ Our power confers responsibility; our strength  
requires restraint.

∟ One billion people in the world look to the American  
President for leadership towards peace. ∟ And all men  
everywhere must trust in him to keep that peace.

∟ I shall be a peace President ... beginning in  
Vietnam and continuing with effective controls on the  
strategic arms race. ~~And I shall look to all Americans, ...~~  
~~as part of the Open Presidency ... for wisdom ... ideas ...~~  
~~and support in my effort~~

As the Prophet Isaiah said: "How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him that bringeth good tidings, that publisheth peace." (Isaiah 52:7)

↳ That should be America's role in the world.

That will be America's role when I am President. |

↳ Second, is the reality of division in American society ... and the paramount need for a new reconciliation.

↳ The President must understand the temper of our people ... their trials ... their fears ... and the key to unlocking their energies in common purpose.

↳ The President must lead the American people away from divisions and discord ... to a trust in our future as a united people.

*Goodness  
Greatness*



↳ The President must inspire us with confidence  
that our efforts will succeed ... that our unity means  
a new freedom for each of us, that no man need fear  
loss when others gain.

↳ And the President must listen to his people ...  
listen to the quiet voice as well as to the loud ... listen  
to the common man as well as to his spokesman. ~~When~~  
~~any one of us calls in need ... or in confusion ... the~~  
~~President must respond.~~

↳ If we are to be a united people, the President  
must serve as a symbol of trust and confidence ... for one  
nation, and one people.

#3 And there is the third reality of our time ... the  
reality of stagnation ... or progress ... in the search for  
human rights ... social justice ... and continued economic  
prosperity.

△ We are a great people ... but our true greatness  
has not been fulfilled. - *Business America confirmed*

In this campaign, I have spoken out for progress,  
despite warnings that Americans have had enough ...  
that they want to be let done ... that our people are  
seeking only ease and security.

I just don't believe it.

△ I believe that the American people now, more than  
ever, ~~before~~ want to press forward in the never-ending  
struggle for justice, the never-ending search for greatness.

I believe they are determined ---

-- that no single child shall go hungry;

-- that no single child shall be denied good health ...

an excellent education ... a chance to unlock the door to  
life ... and develop to the limits of his abilities;

-- that no single family shall live in poverty;

-- that no one who wants to work shall lack a  
job at decent wages;

~~-- and that no segment of society shall be asked to  
carry more than its fair share of the burden of our  
democracy ...and this means thoroughgoing tax reform.  
This also means federal assistance to our cities and  
suburbs to stop the spiralling local property taxes without  
cutting back on essential public services such as education  
and fire and police protection.~~

↳ You here tonight know which party has led this  
fight for more than 30 years -- the Democratic Party.

You know, too, that sometimes we Democrats have differed over issues -- because we care, and we care deeply -- about those issues.

Tonight I am happy to report to you that our party is uniting ... that those brave men who led dissent last spring have been listened to ... that they have made their mark on policy ... and that they are coming home.

With their help, with the help of all of you, we are going to win this election.

⌞ The hour is late. Only five days remain before election day.

Our road has been uphill.

But we're rolling tonight. And we're going to keep on rolling, right down to the wire.

⌞ I urge all of you here tonight, who believe with me ... who believe in the ideals of the Democratic Party ... to give me your help in this election.

⌞ And I urge all the people of Maryland ... all the people of Virginia and the District of Columbia and everywhere else ... whatever their political beliefs, to vote on Tuesday.

⌞ This election is too important for anyone to stay home.

⌞ Voting is always a privilege. This year it is a solemn duty. America needs each and every one of you -- next Tuesday, and in the years ahead.

↳ During my travels this fall, I have seen the wealth of this nation.

I have seen a people glow with fantastic vigor.

My vision of America these last few weeks has made me confident:

- that fear will wither in the voting booth;
- that hope is in our nation's heart;
- that greatness will prevail.

This is the promise of America -- 200 years old -- which, together, we shall fulfill:

- with the firm leadership of a people's President;
- with the courageous effort of the American people;

-- and with the special grace that comes to those who know, as President Kennedy said: "... that here on earth ... God's work must truly be our own."

There is much to do in America.

And together we can do it.
