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VOTERS FACE CRUCIAL DECISION TUESDAY, HUMPHREY SAYS

Elizabeth, N.J., October 31 -- "Don't let anyone tell you there are no life and death issues in this campaign...that you have no choice in this election," Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey said today.

"In the quiet of that polling booth," he said, American voters "are going to make a decision that will determine whether the last third of the 20th Century will be one of progress, of chaos, hope or despair, peace or increasing world tension."

Humphrey cited differences between himself and Nixon on speaking out on the issues and detailing plans for peace in Vietnam, on education, Social Security and Medicare, full employment, elimination of slums, and nuclear weapons control.

Citing the crucial issue of trust, Humphrey said: "Ed Muskie and I have not taken you for granted -- and we never will. We have come to you with the dust of America on our shoes. We have looked you in the eye. We have told you the hard truths about our nation's problems -- and we've told you what we'll do about them, and I think we have earned your trust."

We believe that the Nuclear Test Ban Treaty has helped keep the food you eat and the air you breathe uncontaminated by radioactivity. Mr. Nixon called it a "cruel Hoax."

We believe in the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty. We don't want atomic weapons in the hands of the Nassers and Castros of the world. Mr. Nixon has scuttled this treaty for this session of Congress.

HOUSTON SPEECH

Ladies and gentlemen, as this Presidential campaign draws to a close, as the cliches cool off, as the balloons burst, as the slogans sink into the sunset, one overwhelming issue remains.

Whom do you trust with the most powerful position on earth?

Whom do you trust with the future of America?

Whom do you trust with the future of the world?

Whom do you trust ~~period~~ - period.

Trust between the President and the people can only exist when a man is unafraid to face the people -- when he takes his case directly to them -- honestly and openly.

But Mr. Nixon, the man behind the balloons, thought he didn't have to risk debating the issues before you. He thought he had it made. He thought he had you right in his back pocket. He ^{more than} spent twenty million dollars to make sure. You better check your back pocket, Mr. Nixon. You can't buy the White House, Mr. Nixon.

~~Nobody owns the American people, Mr. Nixon, and I predict they
will make that abundantly clear on November 5th.~~

Ed Muskie and I have come to you with our campaign.

L We believe that the Nuclear Test Ban Treaty has helped keep the food you eat and the air you breathe uncontaminated by radioactivity.

Mr. Nixon called it a "cruel hoax."

We believe that the hopes of mankind are tied to a halt in the arms race. Mr. Nixon has suggested a fifty billion dollar escalation. He says we must negotiate ~~for~~ ^{from} strength, and I agree. We are far and ~~among~~ ^{away} the strongest nation on earth and the time has come to get on with the negotiations. While I'm on this subject, just for a moment consider what if, God forbid, Governor Agnew had to negotiate for the United States at the summit. Is that what Mr. Nixon calls negotiating from strength?

Don't let anyone tell you there are no life and death issues in this campaign. Don't let anyone tell you we can afford to stand still or, ^{worse,} even go backwards ^{the next} for four years.

Everyone of you probably knows at least one fence sitter, or one voter who ^{says he} is going to sit this one out. John F. Kennedy had a favorite quotation from Dante. It went "the hottest places in hell are reserved for those who in time of great moral crisis maintain their neutrality."

I want you all to go out and save at least one soul from hell. That's a campaign contribution that won't cost you a cent, but will add a jewel to your crown in heaven. ~~You get them to the polls and let's not just win this election -- let's make it a smashing victory.~~

In the quiet of that polling booth, you are going to make a decision that will determine whether the last third of the 20th century will be one of progress or chaos, hope or despair, peace or ~~war~~ increasing world tension.

You must decide whom you trust, not only for the next four years, but for the next generation. ~~Because,~~ I firmly believe the world cries out for a generation of great men, a generation of great ideas, indeed, a generation of greatness. Will you find that greatness in the party of Richard Nixon and Spiro Agnew?

I predict America will answer that question on November 5th with a gigantic, "no!"

I don't have to tell you where that generation of greatness is.
