4. The arms race, which breeds insecurity as it feeds on hostility, must be finally terminated.

6. The international community must assist the countries immediately concerned in solving the human tragedy posed by the Arab refugees.

7. The resources of the Middle East countries must be used primarily for human and economic development rather than war and destruction. (water, oil)

Israel must know it does not stand alone in these difficult times. For a country which feels isolated and abandoned is more likely to act irrationally than a country which conducts its affairs with quiet, self-confidence. We must tell the people of Israel that we care.
