We tend to forget what brought our ancestors here. They came because this was a country where the hard-working little hard had a chance to improve his lot.

- IV. Specific issues have changed. But the idea of America has not changed. Still the land of 'the common man'. The little guy still has to fight for his place in the sun.

- V. We don't like high interest rates, inflation, unemployment, low social security, higher medical costs. Every American, regardless of race or income must have a chance at higher education.
- VI. We also know that change and order must go together. No progress from flag-burners, militants, revolutionaries. Change without order is chaos. Order without change is stagnation. We need both. That is what our ancestors demanded. We can deliver.
