REMARKS of HUBERT H. HUMPHREY for HONEY WELL LOCAL 1145 MINNEAPOLIS, MINNESOTA SEPTEMBER 3, 1970

In the past twenty years we have had four recessions.

Each of them has occurred during a Republican

Administration. In the eight Democratic years, from 1960 to 1968, the country enjoyed uninterrupted and unprecedented growth.

In 1968, Republican candidates campaigned up and down this state and country promising to end the inflation by slowing down what was described as an overheated economy.

Well, they have certainly slowed down the economy, but they have only heated up the inflation.

It is almost beyond belief. While thou sands of men in this local have been laid off, consumer prices in the Twin Cities area now stand almost 7% higher than just one year ago.

I know how that must make you feel. On the one hand, the money you earn is buying you less and less. And on the

other, you are worried that you may get layed-off.

This local had a working membership of 13,000 only 6 months ago. Today, after 3000 men and women have been laid-off only 9000 remain. That amounts close to 25% unemployment. 325 were laid-off just last week. It frightens me just to talk about it. I repeat - I know how you must feel.

That's why I want to get back to Washington.

This is a healthy, powerful economy. The problem is that the current set of witchdoctors in Washington have been giving it the wrong medicine. Tight money, idle productive capacity and unemployment are not sound anti-inflation policies. They are "anti-people" policies.

We are going to get to Washington and lend every effort to turn that situation around.

We need to increase productivity so that we can have full employment and real increases in wages. Not increases that are eaten up by inflation before they get into your pocket.

When basic industries arbitrarily raise prices, we are going to

sound off and make them show cause why the people should bear these increased expenses.
