HUMPHREY SAYS ADMINISTRATION TURNS ITS BACK ON AMERICA'S POOR AND HUNGRY

GAINESVILLE, Fla., March 8--Senator Hubert H. Humphrey said today the Nation is losing ground in the battle against poverty and hunger "because a callous Administration has turned its back on 25 million Americans who are ill-fed, ill-housed, ill-clothes and ill-cared for."

Humphrey said th t after a steady decline in the number of Americans living in poverty, the number of poor people actually increased last year for the first time in a decade.

"Does this Administration really care about the poor and hungry in America?" Humphrey asked an "Accent '72" symposium at the University of Florida here.

"The Administration slashed needed funds for the anti-poverty program.

"It tried to torpedo the Food Stamp Program.

"It tried to cut back on school lunches for millions of children.

"It has failed to move on welfare reform.

"It has callously tied up billions of dollars appropriated by Congress that could be used in the battle for decent housing, improved transportation and a wide range of other programs that could improve the lives of the ... American poor.

"It stood idly by for two and a half years and permitted unemployment to climb well over the five million mark. And still it has failed to take the bold steps necessary to put America back to work."

Humphrey said the time has come to put the elimination of poverty and hunger back at the top of the American agenda.

"There are those who say the war agianst poverty has failed, that it raised expectations too high, that it wasn't worth the effort.

"I couldn't disagree more. In the last ten years, one-third of the American poor--14 million people--were lifted above the poverty line.

"And the war on poverty created an awareness in the American conscience that the national tragedy of poverty simply cannot be wished away, a recognition that poor people have rights, and a resolve that they have much to contribute to the American future.

"We can end hunger and poverty in America. But not by closing our eyes as this Administration has done.

"We can succeed only with bold leadership--leadership that resolves to cut unemployment, expand the Food Stamp Program, create day care ecnters for mothers who want to work, and provide decent income levels for those who cannot work."

POVERTY IS MINIMAL. YOU DID NOT LIVE THROUGH A DEPRESSION.

SO YOU CAN ONLY READ ABOUT THE BREAD AND SOUP LINES,

THE FEELINGS OF RESIGNATION, THE LOST HOPES THAT ARE

SO MUCH A PART OF BEING POOR.

AND YOU WILL NEVER HAVE TO GO WITHOUT FATING, OR LACK
THE MONEY FOR DECENT SHELTER AND ADEQUATE CLOTHING, OR
TO SAY TO YOUR CHILDREN, "NO, WE CANNOT BUY A NEW PAIR OF
SHOES OR A NEW TOY."

BUT THE DEPRESSION WAS VERY REAL FOR YOUR PARENTS:

AND POVERTY IN THE U.S. IS VERY REAL FOR YOU. AS LONG AS

ONE CHILD GOES TO BED HUNGRY WE ARE ALL A LITTLE POORER.

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA IS A NATION OF GREAT WEALTH, GREAT RESOURCES, AND GREAT GOALS.

BUT IS ALSO A NATION OF 25 MILLION AMERICANS ILL-FED, ILL-HOUSED, ILL-CLOTHED AND ILL-CARED FOR.

AND, IF THERE EVER A NATIONAL TRAGEDY IN OUR NATION, IT IS THE HUNGER AMONG TUS. WE CAN CLOSE OUR EYES AND HOPE IT WILL GO AWAY-BUT IT WON'T.

WE CAN PRETEND WE DON'T SEE IT, BUT IT WILL REMAIN.
WE CAN SAY IT IS SOMEONE ELSE'S PROBLEM, BUT IS NOT.

IN THE 1960'S OUR NATION PUT THE WAR ON POVERTY AT THE TOP OF ITS AGENDA.

NOW IN THE 70'S SOME HAVE SAID THAT THE WAR WAS A FAILURE, THAT IT RAISED EXPECTATIONS TOO HIGH, THAT IT WAS NOT WORTH DOING.

I SAY IT WAS WORTH DOING. IN THE LAST 10 YEARS,
ONE-THIRD OF ALL THE POVERTY IN THIS NATION WAS ELIMINATED.
OVER 14 MILLION CHILDREN, MOTHERS AND FATHERS ESCAPED THE
CLUTCHES OF BEING POOR.

AND THE WAR ON POVERTY CREATED A CONSCIOUSNESS IN OUR THE LAND--A RESOLVE THAT POOR PEOPLE HAVE RIGHTS, THAT/POOR HAVE A LOT TO CONTRIBUTE TO OUR NATION.

TODAY ALL OF US SHOULD BE TROUBLED, ALL OF US SHOULD BE CONCERNED BECAUSE WE ARE LOSING THE STRUGGLE TO ELIMINATE HUNGER AND POVERTY IN AMERICA.

NO ONE SEEMS TO CARE ANYMORE.

- --THE ADMINISTRATION SLICES THE ANTI-POVERTY BUDGET.
- -- TRIES TO TORPEDO THE FOOD STAMP PROGRAM.
- --IT CUTS BACK ON SCHOOL LUNCHES.
- --IT FAILS TO MOVE AHEAD ON WELFARE REFORM.

SUBJECT: Accent '72 - University of Florida, Cainesville

Bob and I worked on this poverty speech. We think a student audience will be quite receptive to this theme.

I talked to the organizers of the Accent '72 program. They gave me one warning based on the Muskie and Lindsay appearances. at the university.

They said that in the Q and A when you respond to questions on abortion and marijuana, don't say that it's up to the states to decides these issues. Apparently, this was the essence of the Lindsay and Muskie responses. It turned off many students.

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
