NUMPROEY LAURCHES PERHSYLVANIA CAMPAIGN FITH INDICTMENT OF "UNFAIR NIXON TAX AND ECONOMIC FOLICIES"

PHILADELPHIA, April 6--Senator Mubert H. Humphrey launched his Pennsyl - his primary campaign today with a ringing indictment of the Nixon Administration's "inept and inequitable economic and tax policies."

Returning to the city where he is the his candidacy for the Presidency on Jan. 10, Humphrey chose as the site for his tax-economy speech the Internal Revenue Service Plaza here.

"The first priorities of the new administration we must elect next November are clear," Numphrey said.

"We ust overhaul a tax system that is riddled with loopholes and special deals for the super-rich. We must change the inequitable wage-price system that permits prices to sear but holds a rigid line on wages and salaries. And we must end the intelerably high unemployment in this wealthiest Ention an earth.

"I call for a return to fairness where working Americans get hit the hardest -- in our tax system.

"I.1969 and 1970, 300 Americans making more that \$200,000 & year paid no taxes--none at all. Yet a working man living in Philadelphia and earnin \$10,000 a year must pa 28 per cent of his salary in taxes.

"Four decades ago, Franklin D. Roosevelt dedicated his administration to social and economic justice. But today the privileged few still reap vast benefits at the expense of the many.

"I pledge today that if I am successful in this election year, I will re-dedicate the national administration to Franklin Roosevelt's ideal of economic justice."

"Corporations have submitted meanly 7,000 price increase applications. The Nixon Price Coasission turned down only 114 of those requests and forced

a roll-back of price increased in only six cases.

#### MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: IRS RALLY

We have prepared a brief, hard-hitting speech on taxes and the economy. The central theme is fairness. We have found some good information on the tax burden of a working man in Philadelphia who earns \$10,000 a year. He pays \$2,800 or 28 percent of his salary on taxes.

A word on the event: Vic had a good suggestion. When you talk taxes you can point at the IRS building and mention that this is a fitting place to talk taxes. However, there is a real danger of overdoing this and looking powerless and small before a giant structure.

<u>ONE-FACT NOT INCLUDED IN THE TEXT</u>: We just found out that there are only 35 Internal Revenue Agents working out of the regional office where you will speak who are charged with price controls for the entire Eastern half of Pennsylvania. This is a vast area of millions of people and thousands of business establishments. This is a vivid example of the ineffective nature of the controls, of how they can't be enforced.


