#### REMARKS BY SENATOR HUBERT H. HUMPHREY

#### AFL-CIO CONVENTION

BATON ROUGE, LOUISIANA April 10, 1972

TONIGHT, I WANT TO ASK YOU A QUESTION: "WHAT DOES THE AMERICAN LABOR MOVEMENT MEAN TO THE AMERICAN PEOPLE?"

I'VE HEARD ALL KINDS OF ANSWERS FROM ALL KINDS OF CITIZENS TO THIS QUESTION.

SOME PEOPLE ANSWER BY SAYING THAT THE LABOR MOVEMENT IS OBSTRUCTIONIST, THAT IT CAUSES INFLATION, AND THAT UNIONS HAVE NOT MADE A POSITIVE CONTRIBUTION TO AMERICAN LIFE.

SOME SAY THAT THE LABOR MOVEMENT HAS BECOME HARD, MUSCLE BOUND, AND TIRED.

I SAY THEY ARE WRONG--TRAGICALLY WRONG.

AND, I SAY THAT YOU CAN ANSWER THE QUESTION: "WHAT DOES THE LABOR MOVEMENT MEAN TO THE AMERICAN PEOPLE BY ANSWERING: "WHAT HAS LABOR DONE FOR THE AMERICAN PEOPLE?"



HERE'S A PARTIAL LIST:

WE WOULD NEVER HAVE HAD MEDICARE, THE MINIMUM WAGE, WORK SAFETY, OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH, FOOD STAMPS, EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES--WITHOUT THE LABOR MOVEMENT. WE WOULD NEVER HAVE HAD A CIVIL RIGHTS ACT, OR A

SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM WITHOUT LABOR'S HELP.

TO THE DOUBTERS, TO THOSE WHO SCORN THE LABOR MOVEMENT, I WANT TO SAY LOUD AND CLEAR: "LABOR HAS ACTED IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE, IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE AMERICAN WORKING FAMILY.

LABOR HAS A DEEP SENSE OF SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY, A SENSE OF SOCIAL FAIRNESS, A SENSE OF SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC JUSTICE.

THAT'S WHAT THE LABOR MOVEMENT IS ALL ABOUT. DOING THINGS FOR PEOPLE, RAISING THE LIVING STANDARDS OF ALL AMERICANS.

THIS IS HONORABLE. AND, I GLADLY APPLAUD IT.

IN 1972, LABOR FACES ITS MOST CRITICAL BATTLE, ITS TOUGHEST TEST--THE NECESSITY TO DEFEAT RICHARD NIXON.

NO ONE HAS FELT THE FAILURES OF RICHARD NIXON'S ADMINISTRATION MORE THAN THE WORKING FAMILIES OF AMERICA.

THEY ARE THE VICTIMS OF HIGH PRICES, OF HIGH TAXES, OF BROKEN PROMISES, OF MISGUIDED PROGRAMS, AND TRAGIC HIGH UNEMPLOYMENT.



BUT, THEY AND ALL AMERICANS ARE THE VICTIMS OF A DELIBERATELY MISMANAGED ECONOMY IN ANOTHER SENSE TOO. DURING THE NIXON ADMINISTRATION, OUR NATION HAS LOST OVER \$150 BILLION IN PRODUCTION, IN GOODS, IN MANHOURS BECAUSE OUR ECONOMY HAS BEEN PERMITTED TO RUN AT HALF STEAM.

OUR FACTORIES ARE OFTEN IDLE, MEN WORK ONE WEEK AND ARE LAID OFF THE NEXT. OUR ASSEMBLY LINES AREN'T PRODUCING UP TO CAPACITY.

SMALL BUSINESSES ARE GOING UNDER, RESEARCH AND TECHNOLOGY IS BEING CUT BACK, NEW FACTORIES AREN'T BEING BUILT IN THE UNITED STATES AND THERE ARE TOO MANY JOBS GOING ABROAD.

THAT'S WHAT LOST PRODUCTION MEANS, AND IT COSTS EACH OF US DEARLY.

THAT IS \$150 BILLION DOWN THE DRAIN--WASTED, PURE AND SIMPLY WASTED, BECAUSE OUR ECONOMY WAS NOT MOVING, PRODUCING AND GROWING.

THINK OF THE THINGS OUR NATION COULD HAVE DONE WITH THAT LOST AND WASTED MONEY.

THINK OF OUR MASSIVE NEEDS, THINK OF OUR RURAL AREAS AND THE FLOOD OF PEOPLE TO THE CITIES. THINK OF OUR CITIES, UNABLE TO HOUSE AND FEED THE MILLIONS FROM THE COUNTRYSIDE.

THINK OF THE CHILDREN WITHOUT GOOD SCHOOLS, OR THE HUNGRY WITHOUT ENOUGH FOOD.

L ET ME TELL YOU WHAT THAT \$150 BILLION IN LOST ECONOMIC PRODUCTIVITY MEANS.



TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, IT MEANS OVER \$40 BILLION IN LOST REVENUES. TO THE STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS IT MEANS OVER \$10 BILLION IN LOST TAXES. AND, AS A RESULT, WHEN OUR LOCAL GOVERNMENTS DO NOT HAVE A GROWING, PRODUCING TAX BASE, THEY HAVE TO RELY HEAVIER AND HEAVIER ON THE REGRESSIVE TAXES LIKE THE PROPERTY TAX, SALES TAX, AND WAGE TAX.

LOST PRODUCTION MEANS LOST REVENUES, AND LOST REVENUES MEANS THAT THOSE WHO ARE NOW PAYING MUST PAY MORE.

IF WE HAD THE MONEY THE NIXON ADMINISTRATION HAS POURED DOWN THE DRAIN, WE COULD DOUBLE OUR EXISTING HIGHWAY SYSTEM OR INCREASE TEN FOLD THE MONEY NOW SPENT ON MASS TRANSIT. WE COULD PUT 11,7 MILLION STUDENTS THROUGH COLLEGE--WITH LOANS, SCHOLARSHIPS, AND GRANTS FOR YOUR CHILDREN.

WE COULD TRAIN 22.6 MILLION MEN AND WOMEN, WE COULD FIND JOBS FOR THEM, AND HAVE THEM MAKING A CONTRIBUTION TO SOCIETY.

WE COULD HIRE 1.2 MILLION POLICEMEN TO MAKE OUR NEIGHBORHOODS SAFE.

WE COULD BUILD 3 MILLION \$20,000 HOMES--FOR CITIZENS OF ALL INCOMES AND RACES.

WE COULD INCREASE SPENDING FOR EDUCATION--PRESCHOOL, ELEMENTARY, AND SECONDARY--TEN FOLD, FROM \$3.6 BILLION TO BETTER THAN \$40 BILLION A YEAR--GIVING US THE QUALITY EDUCATION WE NEED, AND AT THE SAME TIME REDUCING PROPERTY TAXES.

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WE COULD MAKE THREE AND FOUR FOLD INCREASES IN YEARLY SPENDING FOR MEDICARE, HOUSING, URBAN RENEWAL, WATER POLLUTION CONTROL, AND SEWAGE PLANTS.

BUT, WE WILL NEVER BE ABLE TO DO IT--BECAUSE THE NIXON ADMINISTRATION HAS WASTED, LITERALLY WASTED, THIS MONEY. AND, WHAT HAS THIS LOST PRODUCTION MEANT TO YOU--TO THE AVERAGE WORKING FAMILY.

IT MEANS THINGS ARE TIGHTER. YOU'RE NOT MAKING AS MUCH AS LAST YEAR--BUT YOUR TAXES HAVE GONE UP. YOU DON'T HAVE THE OVERTIME YOU ONCE COUNTED ON TO MAKE ENDS MEAT.

IN FACT, YOU MAY BE OUT OF A JOB OR YOUR WIFE MAY LOSE HER'S FIRST.



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IT MEANS THAT YOU COULDN'T PURCHASE A SECOND CAR--BECAUSE PAYMENTS ON YOUR FIRST ONE MAKE THE BUDGET TIGHT.

IT MEANS THAT HOMES WON'T BE PURCHASED OR REPAIRS MADE ON THE HOME YOU OWN.

IT MEANS BEING FORCED TO SEEK CREDIT AT HIGH RATES

IT MEANS POSTPONING THAT DREAM VACATION YOU AND YOUR FAMILY PLANNED.

IT MEANS MOONLIGHTING ON AN EXTRA JOB, OR HAVING YOUR WIFE WORK, OR MAKING YOUR CHILDREN WORK. AND BANKRUPTCY IS ONLY A PAYDAY AND A HALF AWAY IF YOU'RE LAID OFF.

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IT MEANS BEING ON AN ECONOMIC TREADMILL THAT CLOSES THE DOOR SHUT ON ADVANCEMENT, ON OPPORTUNITY, ON THE FEELING THAT MAYBE SOMETIME YOU WILL GET AHEAD.

THAT'S WHAT \$150 BILLION IN LOST PRODUCTION MEANS--

WHILE CORPORATIONS GET FAT ON TAX LOOPHOLES AND SPECIAL DEALS, THE WORKING MAN IS FORCED TO PAY WITH HIS JOB FOR THE DISASTROUS ECONOMIC POLICIES OF THIS REPUBLICAN ADMINISTRATION.

WHILE THE BANKS AND THE LARGE CONGLOMERATES MAKE RECORD SALES AND HIGH PROFITS, THE WORKING FAMILIES, THE LITTLE GUY, IS TOLD BY THE NIXON REPUBLICANS THAT HE IS AT FAULT, THAT INFLATION IS HIS FAULT, THAT HIS WAGES ARE TOO HIGH, AND THAT

HE HAS TO HAVE FROZEN WAGES SO THAT INFLATION CAN BE STOPPED. THE NIXON ADMINISTRATION ASKS YOU TO FIGHT INFLATION BECAUSE THEY HAVE GIVEN UP THE BATTLE.

I SAY THAT ISN'T FAIR. I SAY IT ISN'T JUST.

I SAY THAT NO ONE HAS THE RIGHT TO PROSPER AT THE EXPENSE OF THE AMERICAN WORKER.

THAT'S WHAT THE LABOR MOVEMENT IS SAYING. AND, THAT IS WHY THEY ARE REPRESENTING ALL WORKING AMERICANS.

THAT IS WHY I AM PROUD TO STAND WITH THE AMERICAN LABOR MOVEMENT.

AND, THAT IS WHY I SEEK YOUR HELP TO BE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES. Tonight, I want to ask you a question? What does the American Eabor movement mean to the American people?

We would never have had a civil rights act, or a program school lunch, with takes laws law .

To the doubters, to those who scorn the labor movement I want to say loud and clear: Labor has acted in the best interest of the American people

labor has a sense of social responsibility, a sense

a sesne of social fairness, a sense of social justice.

That's **D** what the labor movement is all about. Doing things for people, efr-its-members, raising the inity standards of all Americans.

This is honorable. And, I gladly applaud it,

In 1972, Labor faces it most furtical battle, its toughest test-the necessity to defeat Richard Nixon. No one has felt the sins of Richard Nixon's Administrtion more than the working families of America.

Inset A Our factories are often idle, men work one week and are laid off the next. Our assembly lines aren't producing to capacity. Small businesses are going under, research and technology the being cut back, new factories aren't being built in the United States and there are too many jobs going abroad. That's what lost production means and it costs each of us dearly,

To the Federal government, it means \$55 billion in in lost reveneus. To the state and local governments it means over \$10 billion in lost taxes. And, as a result, when our local governments do not have a growing, producing tax base, they have to rely heavier and heavier on the regressive taxes like the property tax, sales tax, and wage tax.

Lost production measn lost reveneus, and lost revenues means that those who are now paying must pay more.

If we had the money the Nixon Administration has poured down the drain, we could double our existing high wya system or increase ten fold the money now spent on mass transit.

We could put 11.7 million students through college-with loans, scholarships, and grants for your children. We could train 22.6 million unemploymables -- to find instrumt -- to find jobs for them, and have them contribution semething to society. We could hire 1.2 millin police--to make our neighborhood safe.

We could build 3 million \$20,000 homes--for citiens of all incomes and races.

We could incrase spending for education--preschool, elementary, and secondary--ten fcold, from \$3.6 billion to better than \$40 billion a year--giving us the quality education we need, and at the same time reducing property taxes.

We could make three and four fold increases in yearyspending for medicare, housing, urban reneal, ,

But, we will never be able to do it--because the Nixon Administration has wasted, litterally wasted, this mem money.

And, what has this lost production meant to you-to the average working family. It means that you could purcause a second car--because payments on your first one make the budget tight.

It means that homes won't be punches or repairs made on the por you have.

It means being forced to seek credit at high rates just to pay bills.

It means postponing that dream vacation you and your wife planned.

It means moolighting an extra job, or having your wife work, or making your children york, but bankruptcy is only a pay day and half away a gyou loud of

It means being on an economic treadmill that closes the door shut on advancement, on opportunity, on the feeling that maybe sometime you will get ahead.

That 'w with \$150 billion in lost production means-and that is the tragedy of the Nixon Administration:

While corpositions get fat on tax loopholes and speical deals, the working man is forced to pay with his job for the disasterous economic policies of this Republican Administration. While the banks and the large conglomerates make record sales and high profits, the working families, the little guy, is told by the Nioxn Republicans that he is a fault, that inflation is his fault, that his wages are too high, and that he has to have frozen wages so that inflation can be stopped.

I say that isn't fair. I say it isn't just.

I say that no one has the right to prosper whiles at the expense of the American worker.

That's what the Labor movement is saying. And, that is why they are representing all working Americans.
