INTRODUCTION TO THE
DEMOCRATIC NATIONAL COMMITTEE
OF
SENATOR GEORGE McGOVERN

AUGUST 8, 1972

Thank you very much. Thank you. I want my friend Senator Eagleton to know that his words of praise at this particular moment are more than welcome. I am very grateful to you, Tom.

I join many hundreds of thousands -- and millions -- of Americans in saluting a great Senator. A Senator from the state of Missouri that gave us a great President. A senator who has earned in his own right the title of courageous man, good man, decent man -- and friend of the Democratic Party of this nation: Tom Eagleton.

Tom, I don't know if you recall what Winston Churchill's wife said to him after his Party's defeat in the election in 1945 in Great Britain.

She said to him, "Winston, it is a blessing in disguise."

I've thought about that -- and I've often thought about what Sir Winston said to Mrs. Churchill.

He said, "If it's a blessing, it's very well disguised."

So, Tom, both you and I know what a blessing is that's "disguised."

But if this country can have two Vice Presidents at one time -- sometimes I think it should, but at no time has any President thought it should -- I would suggest Sarge Shriver and Tom Eagleton as a team.

Somebody asked me about tonight and I said we Democrats never like late-night shows. That's the Republican hour. We in Miami Beach had our late-night show and we thought we'd just do it over, to catch it on prime time with some modest and slight change in cast, but no change in purpose. And here we are.

The signal has already been given. We're in the right city. In case somebody doesn't know it we're about ready to occupy it.

So let the call go from this place: tonight we begin.

Tonight we start our march to the White House!

Tonight we serve notice that the Republican detour on the road of Democratic progress is all over!

Now, let me talk to my fellow Democrats. Tonight I am going to make a request of you.

Tonight I ask Democrats to come home!

Yes, my fellow Democrats, come home to your party, where you belong.

Come home to the party that has given us Presidential leadership to lead this nation in the battle for human rights.

Come home to the party that has consistently fought for full employment, for economic prosperity, and for security for the American working family.

Come home to the party that has given this nation Medicare for the elderly, child care and education for our children, compassion and hope for the less fortunate.

Come home to the party that has given American business and American labor more profits, more jobs, more opportunity, and the highest standard of living that any nation has ever known in recorded history.

Come home to the party which understands that national security is not only a matter of strong military defense, but also a matter of a strong economy, and of a just society in which the people believe in each other, and in which they believe in their government.

My fellow Democrats, set aside your differences -- join hands -- join hands and come home.

The price of disunity is defeat.

We learned that sad lesson in 1968.

And tonight, Richard Nixon is in the White House because too many Democrats wouldn't come home in 1968.

We've had our lost weekend. Enough of this. We have great things to do. The times call for the best that's in us.

This nation was conceived in faith and trust in the people. The very first three words of our Constitution should be the key to everything we think and do as a party, as leaders, and as citizens. Those three words represent the testimony and the testimonial to this nation: "We the people . . ." -- the story of the Republic. "We the people."

And from Jefferson to Jackson to Wilson and then on to Roosevelt, to Truman to Kennedy to Johnson -- our record is one of faith in and one of dedication to "We the people."

The Republican Administration has forgotten "We the people."

And we the people are tired of an Administration that repeats the self-styled litany of No, No, Go Slow, Not Now, Veto. That's not good enough.

Everybody knows tonight America is restless, many Americans unhappy, most of us worried.

We have a right to ask, what is it that Americans want?

Is it something beyond our reach? Is it something far out? Is it something that cannot be achieved? I think the answer is "no."

We the people want a nation at peace and we want an end to the war a Republican president promised he would end and could end.

We think that is a reasonable request.

We the people want jobs -- just jobs -- and a better quality of life.

We the people want our families to be safe from crime.

We the people want the best in education for our children.

We the people want to be treated fairly by our government.

We the people want to end hunger in this land of plenty.

We the people want a government that we can trust, and that we can believe in.

We want a President who reaches out to the young people of America and says: "This White House is your house. You can come home again. There is a friend here, and that friend is George McGovern."

We want a President whose heart goes out to the elderly, to the sick, to the needy and who says to them that America is their home. That man is George McGovern.

We want a President who will turn this popular call for tax reform into what we know can be tax justice. That man is George McGovern.

We want a President who will turn the battle for civil rights for some into the fulfillment of opportunity for all. That man is George McGovern.

We want a President who will make the right for a job into an opportunity for rewarding work. That man is George McGovern.

We want a President who will turn the promise of peace into peace itself. That man is George McGovern.

Few in this audience or this nation know the candidate of this party as I do. I have known him for years. And six months of political competition cannot diminish or destroy better than 10 years of intimate friendship.

George McGovern is my friend. Our friendship has been tested and strengthened by the fires of political competition.

When George McGovern tells me that he wants to lead our nation out of the shadow of the long lines of unemployment into the bright sunlight of economic justice and prosperity, I believe him, because I know him.

When he says that he wants to bring America home to its founding principles, I believe him.

When he says he wants Americans to join together in the days ahead, I join with him.

Tonight I say that all of us can have a vision of tomorrow in America. Because this America is yet a young nation.

Carl Sandburg gave us our text for tonight:

"I see America, not in the setting sun of a black night of despair ahead of us. I see America in the crimson light of a rising sun fresh from the burning, creative hand of God. I see great days ahead, great days possible to men and women of will and vision. . ."

Tonight I have the high honor to present to you and to this nation the man who does have the will and the vision for a new day in America, the next president of the United States, George McGovern.
