I WANT TO TALK TO YOU TODAY ABOUT MATTERS THAT ARE SURELY ON YOUR MINDS AND ALSO ON THE MINDS OF MILLIONS OF AMERICANS -- ECONOMIC CONDITIONS, CONSUMER AFFAIRS, AND NUTRITIONAL PROGRAMS.

GROCERY MANUFACTURE ASSOCIATION MEMBERS HAVE A REAL STAKE IN THESE ISSUES, FOR:

-- A GOOD BOOMING ECONOMY IS GOOD FOR BUSINESS, GOOD FOR COMPANY GROWTH, AND GOOD FOR PROFITS.

-- A POSITIVE CONSUMER PROGRAM BUILDS CUSTOMER CONFIDENCE, DISPELLS FEARS THAT CONSUMERS AREN'T GETTING WHAT THEY ARE PAYING FOR, AND CAN LEAD TO PURCHASING HABITS THAT MIGHT JUST MAKE A CUSTOMER FOR LIFE. -- GOOD NUTRITION IS ESSENTIAL TO THE VERY HEART OF

-- THERE IS THE RECORD OF HIGH UNEMPLOYMENT -- MORE THAN 2 MILLION MORE WORKERS WITHOUT JOBS, SINCE 1968 -- Under Manual -- THERE IS THE RECORD OF A LOUDLY PROCLAIMED POLICY OF HANDS OFF THE ECONOMY -- THEN A WAGE-PRICE FREEZE THAT HAS PLEASED NO ONE AND HAS BEEN OF QUESTIONABLE ACCOMPLISHMENT, -- THERE IS THE RECORD OF HUGE BUDGET DEFICITS OF \$23 BILLION, \$39 BILLION AND PROJECTED DEFICIT THIS YEAR OF AROUND \$20 BILLION. -4-

-- THERE IS A \$25 BILLION FLOW IN OUR MOUNTING BALANCE OF PAYMENTS DEFICIT.

PRODUCTS, PROCESSED FOODS, AND FEEDS HAVE JUMPED ABOUT 7.2%.

YOU ARE WELL AWARE OF THE FACTS.

You have spoken to the President.

You have had an audience with the former Secretary of the Treasury.

YOU HAVE BEEN RAKED OVER THE COALS BY LABOR.

So, I guess you won't mind me telling you what I think --

I RECOGNIZE THAT THE FOOD INDUSTRY IS A COMPLEX AND COMPLICATED INDUSTRY. AND I KNOW THAT THE INDUSTRY HAS BEEN TRYING TO HOLD DOWN THE INCREASING COST OF FOOD.

AMERICAN FAMILIES -- ON AN OVERALL TOTAL -- PUT LESS OF THEIR EARNINGS INTO FEEDING THE FAMILY THAN EVER BEFORE. LESS THAN 16% OF THE FAMILY INCOME GOES TO FOOD. AND THAT AMOUNT IS DECREASING EVERY YEAR.

BUT THAT MEANS VERY LITTLE TO THE HOUSEWIFE, THE FACT IS THAT AMERICAN FAMILIES ARE NOT CONCERNED ABOUT OVERALL TOTALS -- THEY ARE CONCERNED ABOUT WHAT THEY SPEND IN DOLLARS THE FOOD INDUSTRY MUST MEET THIS PROBLEM. IT IS TIME WE TOOK A BUSINESSMAN'S HARD NOSE LOOK AT THE ENTIRE FOOD PROCESSING AND DELIVERY SYSTEM. WE CAN'T HOLD DOWN THE COST OF FOOD WHEN EACH ITEM IS HANDLED FROM BEGINNING TO END TEN AND TWELVE TIMES BEFORE IT REACHES THE CONSUMER WE SIMPLY MUST BRING MORE MODERNIZATION TO THE FOOD INDUSTRY. THE SECOND STEP IN BRINGING DOWN FOOD PRICES IS AN

AGRESSIVE CONSUMER EDUCATION AND CONSUMER PROTECTION PROGRAM.



000640 -8-THE LARGE SUPERMARKET CHAINS COULD BEGIN OPEN DATING OF PERISHABLE FOODS AND MEATS. AND THE MARKETS OUGHT TO BEGIN AN EXPANDED PROGRAM OF UNIT PRICING, IN THIS WAY; EACH CUSTOMER WILL KNOW EXACTLY HIS COST AND BEGIN TO MAKE SOME INTELLIGENT CHOICES AS TO HOW HIS FOOD DOLLAR IS SPENT, EINALLY, ALL COMPANIES OUGHT TO WORK TOGETHER TO ESTABLISH AN EXPANDED PROGRAM OF NUTRITIONAL LABELING. BUT IT WILL TAKE A MASSIVE NUTRITIONAL EDUCATION EFFORT --FROM GOVERNMENT AND PRIVATE INDUSTRY ALIKE. L WE OUGHT NOT TO WAIT WE SHOULD BEGIN IMMEDIATELY. ANATIONAL CONCERN OVER NUTRITION IS NOT NEW SINCE THE PASSAGE OF THE FOOD STAMP ACT IN 1964, AND SINCE THE HEIGHTENED INTEREST IN HUNGER AND MALNUTRITION OF THE LATE 1960's, THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT HAS EMBARKED ON A CONSISTENT COURSE TO STRENGTHEN ALL FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS. AND WE HAVE OF THE D NEW GROUND FOOD STAMPS COST LESS THAN EVER BEFORE. MORE THAN 12 MILLION ARE PARTICIPATING IN THAT PROGRAM. WE HAVE NEW PROGRAMS SUCH AS SCHOOL BREAKFAST. AND WE HAVE LIBERALIZED THE SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM .

UNIVERSAL SCHOOL LUNCH CAN BE A STEP IN THAT DIRECTION. AND LATER IN THIS SESSION, I INTEND TO BRING TO THE FLOOR OF THE SENATE A NEW PILOT PROGRAM TO SUPPLEMENT THE DIETS OF MOTHERS AND INFANTS WHO RESIDE IN LOW INCOME AREAS AND WHO ARE AT NUTRITIONAL RISK BECAUSE OF LOW INCOME AND INADEQUATE DIET THE FACT IS THAT AN ESTIMATED 400,000 INFANTS AND CHILDREN UP TO AGE 4 DO NOT HAVE AN ADEQUATE DIET -- A BARE BONES DIET.
