REMARKS BY SENATOR HUBERT H. HUMPHREY

Communications Workers of America

Annual Convention

Kansas City, Missouri

June 24, 1974

It is a pleasure to be with you today to participate in the Annual Convention of the Communications Workers of America.

It is a special privilege to be here as an honorary member of your great Union and as a life-long friend.

Frankly, as I look around me tonight, I see so many familar faces, that this is more like a family reunion than a national union Convention.

Unfortunately, the most familiar face in the CWA is not with us tonight.

But Joe Beirne has been there when we have really needed him for the past 30 years. And, the strong organization his great leadership has made possible will last and serve now that Joe has decided to retire. This Union, its vitality, its strength, and its compassion for people, is a tremendous tribute to the tenacity, skill, and leadership of Joe Beirne.

Yes, he has been there when you needed him.

Joe Beirne was there in Chicago in 1938 leading the drive to form a national organization of all telephone workers. And, he was there later that year in New Orleans when his labors bore fruit and the National Federation of Telephone Workers was formed.

Joe Beirne was there in Cleveland in 1943 when you called on him to serve as your President. And the wisdom of that decision has been proven over and over again.

Joe Beirne was there leading the ranks of your membership during the great strike against the Bell System in 1947, and at the Miami Convention the same year when the Communications Workers of America came into existence.

Joe Beirne was there just this past January leading the fight that won the right for your Union to bargain nationally with the Bell System.

Joe Beirne has been there when it counted to promote your interests and to protect your hard won victories. And he has put the great power and prestige of your union solidly behind progressive public policies for the benefit of all Americans.

I am proud to be a friend of Joe Beirne, and am sure that even in his retirement he will be a powerful voice for American workers and their families.

I take pride in my identification with your Union and with the entire American Labor Movement.

Throughout our nation's history the American labor movement has been the cutting edge for social progress.

It has championed the cause of people in every generation.

Your Union has been a strong and steady voice not only for its members and their families, but also for the unorganized, the poor, the elderly, the disabled, and those who are the victims of discrimination and prejudice.

As a strong and effective part of American labor, you have stood up for those too weak to stand for themselves, fought for those too weary to fight for themselves, and given visibility to those whose only crime was that "they were not seen."

Working with other liberal and progressive forces, your support of the great presidencies of Franklin Roosevelt, Harry Truman, John Kennedy, and Lyndon Johnson, has made tremendous progress in our nation possible.

The Communications Workers and other major unions have led the fight:

- -- To assure every boy and girl a good education;
- -- To guarantee quality health care at reasonable prices, as a basic right of all Americans;
 - -- To promote human dignity and self-respect,
- -- To provide every American citizen with the full benefits and opportunities of his civil rights;
- -- To assure that the burden of taxation is equitably borne by all, a sure test of a society's justice;
- -- To curb monopoly and unconscionable profiteering, and to insure the benefits of competition in the marketplace; and
- -- To see to it that all our citizens have decent communities in which to raise their families, with safe streets, decent housing, quality education, and good jobs.

But perhaps more important than its specific achievements, this great coalition of America's organized workers and progressives has clearly led our nation in the "politics of compassion."

Democracy can only work if it has a heart as well as a brain.

Government by computer may be more efficient, but it can never be "of, by, and for the people."

Democracy can only flourish when the tears and laughter, anguish and joy, fears and hopes of the people are a very integral part of the political process.

If our coalition of labor and progressive forces have demonstrated anything, it is that compassion and common sense can go hand in hand for the common good.

And we have tasted the bitter fruits of failure to preserve the effectiveness of our coalition. That failure has meant great hardship for the American worker and his family. Hardship resulting from:

- -- The Nixon Budget,
- -- The Nixon vetoes,
- -- The Nixon court,
- -- The Nixon scandals,
- -- The Nixon impoundments, and
- -- The Nixon economic policies.

Let me dwell a moment on the economy.

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Nixonomics has been a disaster for the American worker and his family. But, this should come as no great surprise. As Will Rogers put it years ago, "Republicans take care of big money, and big money takes care of Republicans."

The Nixon Administration has provided much confusion and no direction for our nation's economy.

Since 1969, we have witnessed a game of economic "musical chairs." We have had 4 Treasury Secretaries, 4 Budget Directors, 6 Wage and Price Controllers, 5 Energy Czars, 2 Chairmen of the Council of Economic Advisors and 2 Economic Czars. And now, we have a White House Economic Coordinator.

But these desperate attempts to find economic "saviours" and "scapegoats" have only added to our economic problems. Today, the nation's economic policy apparatus is in complete disarray.

The "revolving-doors" to this Administration's top economic offices have brought not only a dizzying parade of people, but also a bewildering series of policies.

We have experenced an erratic series of "freezes", "phases", and "game plans." On-again, off-again, like a yo-yo, each announced as "THE" answer to our problems, each scrapped soon after as yet another of "THE" many unmet promises of the Nixon Administration.

This "hodgepodge" of economic actions has virtually destroyed the confidence of business, labor, and the consumer in our economy.

The Administration's failure to deal successfully with inflation, recession, and unemployment has apparently convinced it to abandon the fight against these problems.

Today, interest rate policy is the only string being played on the "Nixon Economic Fiddle." And the tune it plays is a sour one for every American family who finds itself lining the pockets of the "money lenders."

The economic statistics paint a grim picture of the plight of the American worker and consumer. They show just how bad a beating you are taking.

- -- Today, it costs you about 9% for a home loan, if you can get the money.
- -- Today, it costs you at least 10% more than it did last year to support your family. And, for those unfortunate people without a good job or living on fixed incomes, their family budgets have exploded by about 20% in one year.
- -- Today, the real value of the average American worker's pay-check -- that its purchasing power -- is 5% below what it was twelve months ago and it is shrinking still further.

Today, the prime interest rate is over 11%, and interest payments now take 25% of the working family budget -- more than twice the "money lenders" share at the end of World War II.

Today, the unemployment lines have swollen to 5.2% of the labor force and the numbers are growing each month.

Despite these facts, the President recently told the nation that "all the economic indicators prove we are making substantial progress."

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But the American people will not be deceived. They have learned the hard way that rhetoric cannot replace lost jobs, and lost income.

No wonder the public is disillusioned with government and politicians. They are sick and tired of this over-promising and under-delivering.

Today people are demanding action from public officials - the premium is on performance. Americans are not children, they are big enough to face up to the truth about the seriousness of our nation's problems, and they want to be told just how things stand - the good news and the bad news.

I propose an agenda of action for Congress, an agenda that is relevant to the needs of the average American working family. It recognizes the value of self reliance as well as government incentive.

First, Congress must take immediate steps to preserve the hard won economic gains that American families have earned over the years. This means the enactment of a strong anti-recession and inflation-control package. It must include a substantial tax cut aimed at inflation-battered lower income taxpayers, and the closing of tax loopholes benefiting the wealthy and corporate sectors. It requires an effective public employment program; easing of credit restriction; and a permanent mechanism to administer a set of largely voluntary price-wage policies.

Second, there must be immediate action to provide every family with participation in a system of national health insurance.

Third, Congress must develop a national energy policy, and millions of Americans will personally suffer if we do not act.

Fourth, it is essential that Congress enact effective measures to address an increasingly severe food crisis.

Fifth, any legislative agenda must include the enactment of a Balanced National Growth and Development Act to provide government at all levels with planning mechanisms to make rational decisions on how our nation should grow and how policy makers should organize government to meet future needs.

Finally, Congress must reform its own institutions and modernize its machinery. A 20th Century Congress cannot be content with employing 18th and 19th Century techniques.

If the Congress is to be taken seriously by the public and the President, if faith and confidence in government are to be restored, this agenda must be acted upon.

For six years the "politics of compassion" have taken a back seat to the "politics of indifference."

We have seen the bitter fruits of negative politics in the sacking of the poverty programs, impounding of funds for the sick and the needy, gutting of housing programs, the retreat from the commitment to make our cities liveable. We have witnessed the callous abuse of the veto power to block programs for some of those in America that most need the help of this government - the physically and mentally handicapped and our working poor.

Government "of the few, by the few and for the few" has no place in America.

But I have great faith in America. I have confidence in the American people.

If organized labor and progressive public leaders work together, we will pull ourselves up and reverse the decline suffered in the Nixon years.

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We have done it in the past and we shall do so again;

- -- Under Roosevelt, from the Great Depression,
- -- Under Truman, from the threat of post-war economic collapse at home and abroad,
 - -- Under Kennedy, from a serious recession,
- -- Under Johnson, from the crushing weight of the cycle of poverty and discrimination toward fulfilling the ideals of opportunity for every American.

Our people have a right to expect the same kind of effective, comprassionate, leadership in the future. And I am confident that it will be forthcoming.
