MINNEAPOLIS, MINNESOTA

- CURRENT ECONOMIC CRISIS IS A HARDSHIP ON ALL AMERICANS - CONSUMERS AND WORKERS - BUT IS ALSO A DANGEROUS THREAT TO OUR COMPETITIVE SMALL BUSSINESS ENTERPRISES.

- The raging inflation that has pushed prices up 10.7% in the past year and 19% in the last two years, coupled with the second Nixon Administration recession, has dealt a devastating blow to small business.

- WHILE BIG BUSINESS HAS BEEN ABLE TO GET SCARCE RAW MATERIALS AND OTHER ESSENTIAL COMMODITIES, SMALL BUSINESSES ARE OFTEN LEFT AT THE END OF THE SUPPLIERS LINE. - THE TOTAL RELIANCE ON HIGH RATES OF INTEREST, BY THE ADMINISTRATION, TO HALT INFLATION CRIPPLES SMALL BUSINESS. WHEN YOU ARE SMALL AND COMPETITIVE, YOU CANNOT SIMPLY PASS THESE HIGHER COSTS ALONG TO YOUR CUSTOMERS THE WAY THE OLIGOPOLISTS CAN. THERE AREN'T MANY SMALL BUSINESSMEN WHO CAN AFFORD TO BORROW AT TODAY'S RATES OF 15 or 16%.

- The reduction in real GNP means fewer goods are being produced, sold, and transported. This hurts your business. And, when truck drivers' incomes fail to keep pace with infaltion, they cut corners in every way they can.

- YET, ADMINISTRATION HAS BEEN VIRTUALLY HELPLESS IN ITS EFFORTS TO FIGHT A FALTERING ECONOMY.

- No strong economic leadership -A "REVOLVING DOOR."
- NO REAL ECONOMIC POLICY -"YO-YO" APPROACH,
- PHASES AND FREEZE ABANDONED, AND HIGH INTEREST RATES NOW THE ONLY STRING ON NIXON ECONOMIC FIDDLE.

- ASSURE FAIR GOVERNMENT POLICIES - TAX REFORM, GOVERNMENT REGULATION, ETC. - FAIR TO THE SMALL BUSINESSMAN AND THE CONSUMER AND NOT JUST WORKED OUT WITH THE CORPORATE LAWYERS

- ALLOCATION OF CREDIT AT REASONABLE RATES TO PRIORITY AREAS - SMALL COMPETITIVE BUSINESS IS ONE SUCH PRIORITY - THIS IS TOO IMPORTANT A DECISION TO BE LEFT TO THE BANKERS,

- BETTER LONG TERM PLANNING OF OUR NATION'S GROWTH - BALANCE NATIONAL GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT -AND ALLOCATING ITS RESOURCES - BUDGET REFORM,

- REALIGNMENT OF GOVERNMENT SPENDING PRIORITIES - MORE AT HOME, LESS ON DEFENSE, FEWER TAX BREAKS FOR THE RICH,

- WITH THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH IN A WEAKENED STATE, CONGRESS MUST EXERCISE ITS LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES AND GET THE NATION'S ECONOMY MOVING AGAIN WITH MUCH REDUCED INFLATION.

- WHILE THE CURRENT ECONOMIC CRISIS IS A GREAT CHALLENGE TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, IT IS ALSO A TREMENDOUS OPPORTUNITY TO RESTORE PUBLIC CONFIDENCE AND TRUST IN ITS FUNDAMENTAL FAIRNESS AND EFFECTIVENESS IN DEALING WITH THE NATION'S MOST SERIOUS PROBLEMS.
