May 17, 1975

I am happy to be here with you tonight.

There are few places I would rather be than with the people who sustain this Party -- its program, its candidates, and its elected officials.

I take great strength from meeting with you. It is, as always, a privilege to address you.

My thoughts are never far from the DFL and its people.

And let me say at the outset, on behalf of each of us seated before you this evening, "Thank you, for making it possible for us to work on behalf of the progressive interests of this state and nation."

No man or woman can long stand alone in politics. One is only as strong as those who will work with him. And that is true when we campaign, when we legislate, and when we administer.

When we construct, when we build, when we launch new programs, we do it together. This Party is the fusion of two progressive and colorful political parties -- the Democratic and the Farmer-Labor. We share the proud heritage of Thomas Jefferson and Andrew Jackson, and that of John A. Johnson and Floyd B. Olson.

Working together, united by common interests under the same banner, a unique kind of citizen-based party politics has been built here in Minnesota, and today it serves as an example to the nation.

It's a kind of politics that understands straight talk, that places performance ahead of promise, that prefers character to charisma, and that develops constructive programs out of intense debates.

I am proud of this Party because of what it means to the people of Minnesota and what it has done for the people of Minnesota.

They know what electing a DFL governor and a DFL legislature meant for the people of this state.

To those in the dawn of life, DFL government brought better schools and child care and medical treatment programs.
