

REMARKS OF SENATOR HUBERT H. HUMPHREY

FUNDRAISER FOR GOVERNOR ART LINK

Jamestown, North Dakota

May 15, 1976

I am very happy to be here tonight, back among my good friends in the State of North Dakota.

And I am happier still to honor my personal friend, a great Democrat and an outstanding Governor -- Art Link.

The people of North Dakota are very fortunate. Art Link is a Governor who knows what he is talking about.

I don't mean that lightly. A governor of this state, or any of the prairie states, has a double responsibility. Like his colleagues in other areas of the country, he has to run an efficient and effective state government.

But to serve North Dakota effectively, he has a special responsibility to understand the land. And I mean really understand it -- from right down where the coal lies buried to up on top where the wheat waves in the wind.

There aren't many men left in America who can do both of those things. But Art Link can and does.

He understands government and how to make it work. And he is no newcomer to it. From the time that he was a young man in McKenzie County, he became active on the School Board, the Township Board and the Welfare Board.

He served you well for 24 years in the State House of Representatives and became one of its most distinguished Speakers in 1965. When you sent him to Congress from the Second District in 1970, he worked hard there -- and there was plenty to be done.

And when you saw fit in your wisdom to put him in the State House in 1972, he accumulated a fine record and a national reputation, and became a widely-respected Governor.

So Art Link knows about government. But equally important, he knows the land as few people can know it.

Art was born on the same farm that his parents homesteaded at the turn of the century, and he lives there still. He has been and is a successful farmer and rancher. And when he talks, people listen -- because he knows what he's talking about.

Art Link's whole life has been lived in partnership with the rolling landscape of this state. He knows what this good North Dakota land means to our people, and what it will continue to mean to our children and their children for decades to come.

He has seen what happened to our Eastern Appalachian states, and how they suffered in the rush to extract the wealth from their soil. He has seen it, and he doesn't like it. And he doesn't want it to happen here.

But he has also seen that our people need jobs and they want to share in the prosperity around them. He is disturbed when young people leave the state for employment elsewhere, and he would like to find ways to keep them here.

The Prairie States are going to face tough questions in the months ahead. And, one way or another, those questions are going to get answered. But when they do, the people of this state will be fortunate to have a spokesman who shares their lives and their love of the land -- Governor Art Link.

Moreover, the whole United States will be facing tough questions for the future this year, even as we are in the midst of celebrating our past.

This year is our nation's Bicentennial.

We honor the daring, pioneering spirit of those early Americans who launched our bold experiment in democracy.

We praise and admire those who defied the established limits of their time, cast aside the comfortable rhetoric of the period and risked the creation of a new political order.

And today, as a nation, we can be justly proud of our accomplishments; among them, the great contributions we have made in the struggle for social justice and human dignity.

At the same time, we must be mindful that the future provides tremendous challenges and opportunities for fulfilling the dreams of our founders.

As we look back on the past seven sad years of Republican control of the White House, it is time to demand an accounting.

All we are getting now is empty rhetoric -- another "cover-up" for disastrous Republican performance.

Let's take a quick look at what it has meant to have Republicans in charge of the White House:

-- From 1961 to 1969, when the Democratic Party was in the White House, we created 13 million new jobs.

We reduced unemployment to 3.6 percent in 1968, with an inflation rate averaging under 2.5 percent.

-- In the last three years, the Nixon-Ford team has been able to increase employment by a mere one million jobs.

They have managed to push the official unemployment rate to an 8.5 percent average in 1975 and higher in state after state.

Since 1972, the Republicans have provided exactly one job for every four new job seekers in our country.

Only one job for every four persons!

-- In the Democratic Sixties, with Presidents Kennedy and Johnson in the White House, the weekly take-home pay of the working man or woman, after inflation, rose by 12.4 percent!

-- In the past three years alone, that same man or woman has experienced a drop of 5.4 percent in the real value of their take-home pay.

Yes, it's a fact: Republican economic mismanagement has pushed the working families of America back ten years to their 1965 income level.

But not everyone has lost since 1969 under the Nixon-Ford team.

The richest 20 percent of our population actually increased its share of the total income of our nation during this period of economic suffering for most Americans.

A shift of about \$20 billion from the pockets of working families to the coffers of the super-rich has occurred as a result of Republican economics.

The Republican record of recession and retreat from the problems of America has forced the party of Grant, Harding and Hoover to develop a new strategy in this Presidential election year.

It's a strategy which runs away from the issues rather than running on a record.

Now, let me ask you -- if you were a Republican, would you admit the incompetence that has characterized the Nixon-Ford Administration?

Of course not!

So, why do you think Ronald Reagan is running against the government? And why do you think the President acts as if he is fresh off the boat and unfamiliar with the Republican record?

These Republicans have made a choice.

They will run against the government, against the Congress, against the Courts, against their own past promises.

Let's look at the promises they made:

-- The Republicans once promised balanced budgets.

But they have given us the highest budget deficits in our history.

-- They once promised jobs and sang the glories of the work ethic.

But they have given us the highest levels of unemployment since the Great Depression and have been content to let welfare rolls swell and job rolls dwindle.

-- They once promised a stable dollar.

But they have given us the highest inflation rate in our 200-year history.

-- They once promised free enterprise, but they have given us more rules and more regulations than ever before, and forced over 12,000 businesses to close their doors in 1975 alone.

-- The Republicans once promised us good government. But they are guilty of more mismanagement and outright corruption than any time since Ulysses Grant and Warren Harding.

-- They once promised law and order, yet they preside over the highest crime rate in the history of the country.

Today, we are seeing and hearing another cover-up! A cover-up of Republican failures! A cover-up of mismanagement and broken promises.

But I say tonight, the Democrats will expose that cover-up and justice will be done in November.

There will be no pardons for the Republicans in 1976.

We must challenge the Ford-Reagan-Republican anti-government, anti-politics propaganda and call it what it really is -- the biggest, best organized case of public deception since Watergate!

But there is an even worse side to this current Republican campaign.

They are leading a mass retreat from our historic decades of progress toward social justice and human dignity.

They tell us what not to do, not what we can and should do.

Mr. Nixon and Mr. Ford, Mr. Reagan and Mr. Simon have devised a blue-print for rolling back progressive social policies and laying waste the hopes of those who look for a more just, more equitable America.

They are attacking the very programs that help people -- education, Medicare, the Job Corps, housing, food stamps, school lunches.

I know that the American people will reject this course, because a new day is dawning across the nation.

We are near the end of our long nightmare of failure, reluctance and retreat.

Our future is in our hands -- yes, and in our votes this year.

But to defeat the Republicans is not enough -- we must win for the people.

And our people in this Bicentennial Year are asking what legacy we will leave to future generations, and they are remembering the kind of goals that were important to the first Americans.

Our forebearers asserted the inalienable rights of people to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. They believed in and trusted the people.

They sought to create a new society that would stand for nothing less than a full measure of human freedom and opportunity.

Those are great ambitions. They challenge all of us, here in North Dakota and across the nation, to consider the kind of America that our children and grandchildren will inherit.

Will they live in a society which refuses to see that adequate health care is available to all?

Will they grow to adulthood without knowing the value of work, because we have too few jobs for them?

Will they learn only to distrust Government and to ask less of themselves in the process?

Will they live in an America that forgets its poor -- its needy -- its less fortunate?

They will not -- if we have the courage to live up to our beliefs.

If we believe in work, we must have a government that offers America a full employment policy that assures decent jobs at decent wages for all Americans.

If we believe in sound administration, we must have a program of long overdue reform to clean up the welfare mess -- yes, and to modernize programs for modern days.

If we believe in the right of every American to a full life, then we need a national health care system that provides quality health services for all at the lowest possible cost.

If we believe in the right of all Americans to pursue excellence, we must support efforts to improve the quality of education and the way it is financed.

If we believe in our cities, we must have effective community development and housing programs -- to replace slums with quality housing, and to establish interest rates that make home ownership a reality for working people once again.

If we believe in fair play, then we must have a tax program that eliminates the glaring tax loopholes that make it possible for the super-rich and the giant corporations to pay little or nothing while the middle-income taxpayer bears the major burden of government expenditures.



If we want to improve the quality of life for all Americans, then we must protect our environment and conserve our resources.

If we believe in an expanding economy, then we must have an energy program that assures America of energy resources for decades to come.

And, most important, we must have national leadership that works with compassion and understanding and is clearly "of, by and for the people."

A favorite quotation of mine summarizes the kind of vision we must offer to the American people.

It comes from the great American poet of the Midwest who seemed to understand the heartbeat and the spirit of this nation.

These are the words of Carl Sandburg. He speaks for me, as I know he speaks for Governor Link and the people of this great state:

"I see America, not in the setting sun of a black night of despair ahead of us. I see America in the crimson light of a rising sun, fresh from the burning, creative hand of God. I see great days ahead, great days possible to men and women of will and vision..."

Yes, as we will it, so shall it be! A nation without a vision shall perish. But a people with hope shall triumph!

Now is not the time to retreat.

It remains only for us to reach out, to risk and to dare greatly.

High hopes -- great dreams. Build, grow, strive -- create!

Whether or not we are fully successful, at least we owe it to ourselves to try!
