

N. J. Wooing Connecticut As TV Ally

Trenton, Aug. 30 (AP)—Gov. Meyner will court Connecticut support in his battle to retain New Jersey control of the state's only television station. Meyner meets with Gov. Rockefeller of New York and Gov. Dempsey of Connecticut today in Rockefeller's office.

He told a news conference yesterday it would also be to Connecticut's advantage to oppose the conversion of WNTA-TV (Ch. 13) into a New York-based educational outlet.

Meyner said he expected that in a year or so the educational television group would be asking New Jersey and Connecticut for subsidies to continue the operation.
